SUBJECT: Accept Amendment to Certification of May 17, 2016 Municipal Primary Election Results

The Multnomah County Elections Division has filed with the Office of the City Auditor an amendment to the abstract of votes for the Municipal Non-Partisan Primary Election held in the City of Portland on May 17, 2016. Eight City of Portland ballots from the Clackamas County Elections Division were submitted to the City on June 17, 2016 and added to the total for candidates and measures. Clackamas County certified the additional ballots and final results with the Secretary of State's Office on June 23, 2016. The additional ballots represent no change in candidates elected, nominated, or measures passed.

Ballot measure 26-173 with the caption "Temporary Motor Vehicle Fuel Tax for Street Repair, Traffic Safety", qualified to the ballot by City Council-referral and was approved as follows:
