

RESOLUTION NO. 30725

A Resolution in support of Oregon State Ballot Measure No. 4, "Pollution Control Bonds", appearing on the May Primary Ballot, urging favorable consideration by affected voters, as this measure in connection with the City of Portland Measure No. 1 (Ballot Measure No. 51) "Anti-Pollution Aid Through Sewer Users Charges", will enable Portland to finance an accelerated program to upgrade water quality of the rivers in the Portland area by: addition of secondary treatment facilities to the Columbia Treatment Plant, expansion of the Tryon Creek Treatment Plant, modernization and continued improvement of Portland's sewage collection system, including accelerated progress in separation of storm and sanitary sewers.

WHEREAS, the Environmental Quality Commission of the State of Oregon has established a July 1972 deadline for compliance with higher Federal and State standards of water quality, in the rivers of our State, and


WHEREAS, the City of Portland cannot meet this deadline, using available funds collected through existing Sewer Users Service Charges, plus State and Federal Grant assistance, and

WHEREAS, State of Oregon Ballot Measure No. 4, "Pollution Control Bonds", will allow the State to sell bonds to establish a fund from which loans and grants can be made to cities for construction of pollution abatement facilities, and

WHEREAS, City of Portland Ballot Measure No. 1, (Ballot Measure No. 51) "Anti-Pollution Aid Through Sewer Users Charges", will allow the establishment of sewer user service charges in relation to needs and provide funds for repayment of a loan made to the City by the State under provisions of State Measure No. 4; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of Portland that the Council does hereby urge all those voters eligible to vote in the primary election, to be held May 26, 1970, to vote yes on State of Oregon Ballot Measure No. 4, "Pollution Control Bonds", and City Measure No. 1, (Ballot Measure No. 51) "Anti-Pollution Aid Through Sewer Users Charges", so that the City of Portland may meet its obligation to insure higher water quality for the waters of our State.
