## ORDINANCE No. 149365

An Ordinance authorizing transfer of appropriation in the amount of \$15,530 within the General Fund from General Operating Contingency to Office of City Auditor, Materials and Services, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The 1979-80 budget of the City Auditor included \$28,000 to continue publication of a condensed version of the Council agenda and publication of the Planning Commission agenda in the two major daily newspapers.
2. Council agenda publications have been more extensive than anticipated because of the number of items of general interest and the continuation of items from week to week.
3. Planning Commission publications have included, not only the projected Planning Commission agenda, but the Design Committee, the Sign Review Committee and the Historical Landmarks Commission agendas, which were not provided for in the budget amount.
4. Expenditures for this purpose total \$24,000 through January and an additional \$18,000 should be provided by transfer in order to continue such publication at the present level through the end of the fiscal year.

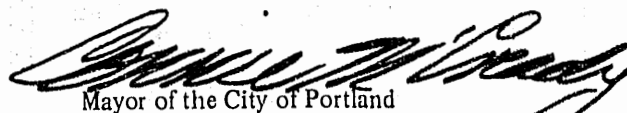
NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. Appropriation in the amount of \$15,530 is hereby transferred within the General Fund from General Operating Contingency (20100010) to Office of City Auditor, Materials and Services (33600071, Object Code 260).

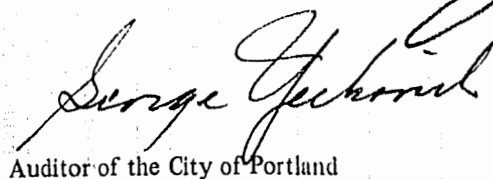
