## ORDINANCE NO. 190253

Authorize the Chief Human Resources Officer to enter an initial three-year period to provide benefit eligible employees access to fertility and family planning benefits for an amount not to exceed \$350,000 over the life of the initial contract (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. This Ordinance supports the City of Portland's Core Values of Anti-Racism, Equity, Transparency, Communication, Collaboration and Fiscal Responsibility.
- 2. Commissioner Fritz, working in partnership with Diverse Empowered Employees of Portland (DEEP) affinity groups, has advocated for policies and benefits that are sensitive and inclusive of the many paths City employees may take to parenthood.
- 3. The Labor Management Benefits Committee (LMBC) participated in a subgroup with the Benefits Office and its consultant to develop a request for proposal for fertility and family planning benefits, which identify fiscally responsible benefit options which are inclusive of all City employees and support a variety of pathways to parenting, and select the finalists.
- 4. The chosen provider contract would begin on or before July 1, 2021 for an initial three-year contract period and not to exceed amount of \$350,000 over the life of the initial contract, with an option to renew up to the City's contracting guidelines.
- 5. Conventional fertility benefits typically restrict access to same-sex couples, single parents, and those seeking adoption and/or surrogacy services by requiring precertification or a diagnosis to access necessary treatment. The City's health plans are restricted by IRS tax codes from offering inclusive fertility and family planning benefits, resulting in the need for a third party offering. Treatment for infertility, once diagnosed, is not covered under the City's self-funded plans and is currently limited to partial coverage (50%) of involuntary infertility and artificial insemination under the Kaiser plan.
- 6. Contracting with a third party will provide access to diverse providers of varying specialties (physicians, OBGYNs, midwives, doulas, nutritionists, lactation consultants, etc.), access to care advocates via multiple modalities, local discounted fertility services, access to community resources, mental health support, coordination of care with health plan and EAP vendors, and other similar benefits.

7. The Health Operating Fund has sufficient appropriation in support of the benefit listed above.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. The Chief Human Resources Officer is authorized to enter into a vendor contract providing benefit eligible employees access to fertility and family planning benefits. This contract would begin on or before July 1, 2021 for a three-year period, with an option to renew, but not to exceed a cost to the City of \$350,000 within the initial contract period.
