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

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Project Requirements and Objectives




- On-Call Contracts for Public Sanitary Sewer Extensions
- Maintains sewer service to existing rate payers
- Responsive to situations arising during the City's rapid development climate and old failing private sewers and septic systems



Urgent construction required – commonly within 6 months

NW Aspen Avenue – Potential Loss of Service

- Party sewer connection without an easement
- Neighbor submitted 6-month capping notice
- At risk of losing sewer service
- NCS Standard Conversion Fee to resident: \$7,100





N Exeter – Failed Septic System



- State rules prevent repair of septic systems within 300 feet of public sewer
- Extended sewer to property to allow continued occupancy
- SDC, line and branch fees to resident \$23,400

Project Schedule and Budget

- FY 20 FY 24 Establish new annual contracts
- Move to Purchasing in January 2021
- 3 to 4 contracts targeted for Prime Contractor Development Program.
- 9 years of experience has proved successful
- BES capital budget allows up to \$3M annually
