> NOTICE OF WITHDRAWAL OF DETERMINATION AND ISSUANCE OF AMENDED DETERMINATION Campaign Regulation Complaint No.: 2020-31-TW

- On Reconsideration: Violation and Civil Penalty -

Dear Ted Wheeler and Friends of Ted Wheeler,

On August 7, 2020, the City of Portland Auditor's Office issued the complaint named above, alleging campaign contribution violations under <u>Portland City Charter Section 3-301</u> and corresponding <u>Portland City Code (PCC) Section 2.10.010</u>. Specifically, the complaint alleged Friends of Ted Wheeler violated City campaign finance regulations by receiving individual contributions in excess of City campaign contribution limits.

On September 4, 2020, the Auditor's Office issued a determination finding seven violations of City campaign regulations and issued a mandatory civil penalty. By this letter, the Auditor withdraws that determination. **On reconsideration, the Auditor's office finds one violation and issues a mandatory civil penalty of \$1,000.**

Context and Background to the Complaint

On June 25, 2020, the Auditor's Office sent a notice of complaint alleging contribution limit violations by an individual contributor to Friends of Ted Wheeler (Complaint No. 2020-21-TW). On July 8, 2020, the Auditor's Office received a separate email from the campaign stating it had performed a self-audit in efforts to retroactively comply with campaign contribution limits. In



good faith, the campaign reported discovering seven excess donations totaling \$3,250 that it then refunded to contributors. On July 27, 2020, the Auditor's Office issued its determination in Complaint No. 2020-21-TW.

On August 7, 2020, the Auditor's Office issued Complaint No. 2020-31-TW (this complaint) based on the information received from the campaign in the July 8, 2020 email and having formed a reasonable belief of potential unaddressed violation(s) of City campaign finance regulations.¹

City campaign finance regulations limit total aggregate contributions to \$500 from an individual to a candidate during each election cycle. See <u>City Charter Section 3-301(a)–(b)(1)</u> and <u>PCC</u> <u>Section 2.10.010 A.– B. 1.</u> On May 4, 2020, the City Auditor's Office began enforcing these provisions,² including enforcement against any contributions after May 4, 2020 that raised an individual's contribution total to over \$500 for a candidate. Candidates qualified to appear on the ballot for the May 19, 2020 Primary Election were given notice on April 29, 2020 of the change in law and new enforcement date.³

For candidate Ted Wheeler, the relevant election cycle ran from July 6, 2016⁴ until July 29, 2020. In its investigation, the Auditor's Office identified the campaign's seven contributors of concern to be Jim Mark, William R. Swindells, N. Robert Stoll, Vanessa Sturgeon, John Andrews, Charles Swindells, and Warren Rosenfeld.

Please note: Contributions in question connected to Charles Swindells and Warren Rosenfeld are addressed in Complaint Nos. 2020-29-TW (Amended), 2020-29-CS, and 2020-29-WR. As such, those contributions are considered duplicative, and are thereby excluded from this complaint.

Violation of City Campaign Finance Regulations

Aggregate individual contribution exceeded contribution limits

The investigation results for contributions from the remaining contributors are summarized as follows:

As identified in the tables above, there were five instances in which individuals made contributions to Friends of Ted Wheeler during the same election cycle and in excess of the \$500 contribution limit. In four of those instances, the campaign refunded the excess of those contribution amounts within the 30-day window in which the state requires the campaign to report its contributions in ORESTAR, including refunded contributions. ORS 260.057(2). Because the campaign refunded four of the five contributions within the applicable reporting timeframe, on reconsideration I find the only unlawful contribution received by the campaign for purposes of City Code Section 2.10.010 A. was the \$500 contribution from William R. Swindells on May 26, 2020. **Therefore, I find one violation of the City's campaign finance regulations.**

Penalties

The City campaign finance regulations require financial penalties following violations of campaign contribution limits. In particular, each violation of City Charter Article 3 and corresponding City Code Chapter 2.10 requires a fine of "not less than two nor more than twenty times the amount of the unlawful Contribution or Expenditure..."⁵ In determining the required penalty within the range allowed, I considered the following factors:

- The campaign voluntarily issued refunds and disclosed the violations to the Auditor's Office during efforts to amend practices,
- The timing of violation transactions in relation to notices and determinations issued previously,
- The identified individual contributors with violating contributions were first-time violators in this elections cycle,
- The cooperation of the parties with the investigation,
- The amount of any penalties issued in similar circumstances,
- Whether the campaign issued any refunds to the individual contributors, and
- The fact that the City's definition of Elections Cycle differs from the State of Oregon's.

Based on these factors, the fine issued is the lowest amount allowed, or two times the total unlawful contribution amount of \$500 resulting in a fine of \$1,000.

Friends of Ted Wheeler shall pay \$1,000 to the City Auditor's Office by March 1, 2021.

NOTE: Late payments for fines may be subject to an increase in fee.

Appeals

Pursuant to PCC 2.10.050 I., an appeal may be filed with the Multnomah County Circuit Court within 30 days of the issuance of a decision.
