ORDINANCE No. 190288

Authorize a competitive solicitation and contract with the lowest responsive and responsible bidder and provide payment for construction of the Ankeny Pump Station Odor Treatment System Rehab Project No. E11093 for an estimated amount of \$1,200,000 (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Ankeny Pump Station Odor Treatment System is designed to treat foul air from the Ankeny Pump Station wet well and the Ankeny Shaft located at the Waterfront Park. This facility is currently out of service due to a flood event in 2015 that damaged the equipment and control system. The Bureau of Environmental Services (BES) has initiated a project to rehabilitate and bring the odor treatment system back to service.
- 2. The estimated cost is \$1,200,000. The Project Estimate Confidence Level Rating Index per Resolution 36430 is "High."
- 3. Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY 2020-21 and FY 2021-22 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, Project Number E11093.
- 4. BES seeks Council's authorization for Procurement Services to issue a competitive solicitation and execute a contract for the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Chief Procurement Officer is authorized to facilitate the use of the competitive solicitation process in accordance with City Code Chapter 5.34 in order to obtain the most responsible and responsive bid for the construction of the Ankeny Pump Station Odor Treatment System Rehab project.
- b. Upon the Council's acceptance of the Chief Procurement Officer's report recommending the lowest responsible bidder, the Chief Procurement Officer is authorized to negotiate and execute a contract, provided the contract has been approved as to form by the City Attorney's office, with the lowest responsive bidder for the purposes described in Section 1.
- c. The Mayor and City Auditor are hereby authorized to pay for the contract from the Sewer System Operating Fund Budget when demand is presented and approved by the proper authority.
