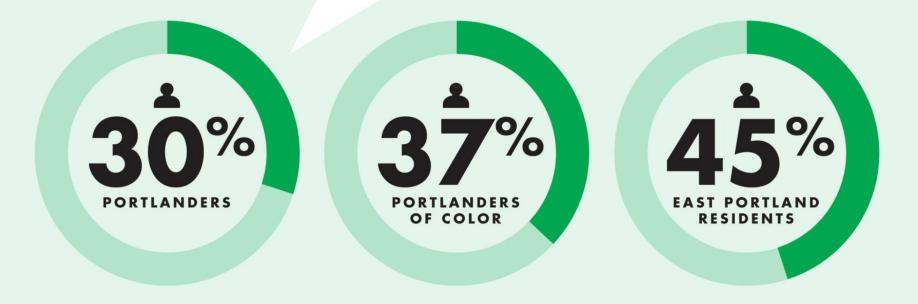

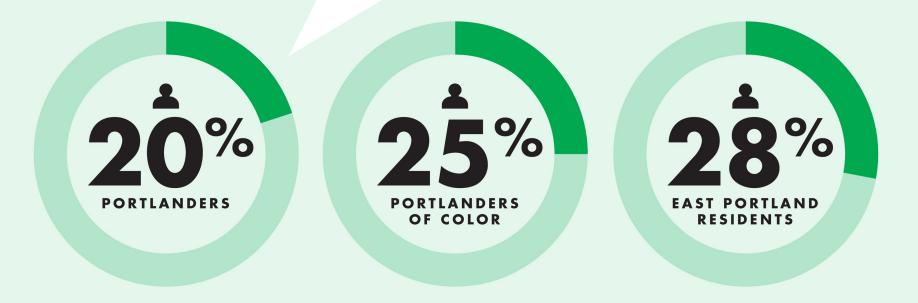

Summer 2020 Estimated Service Reductions:

- Over 800,000 fewer visitors to programs and events
- 32,000 registered participants lost (10,000 summer campers)
- 12 community and arts centers closed
- 12 indoor and outdoor pools closed
- Large permitted park events canceled
- 1,700 seasonal employees laid off/not hired

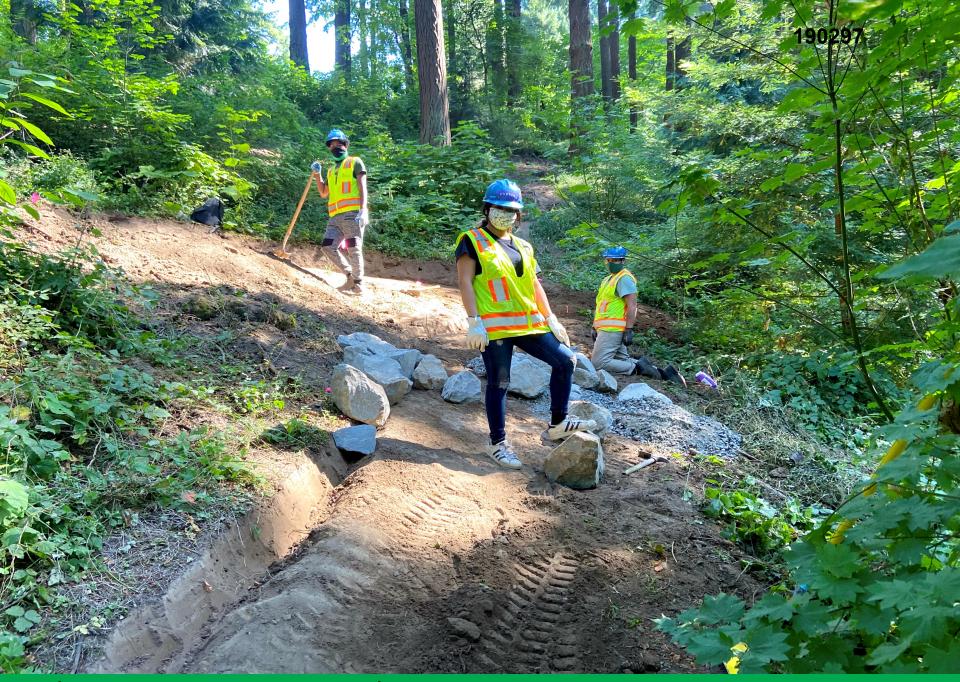

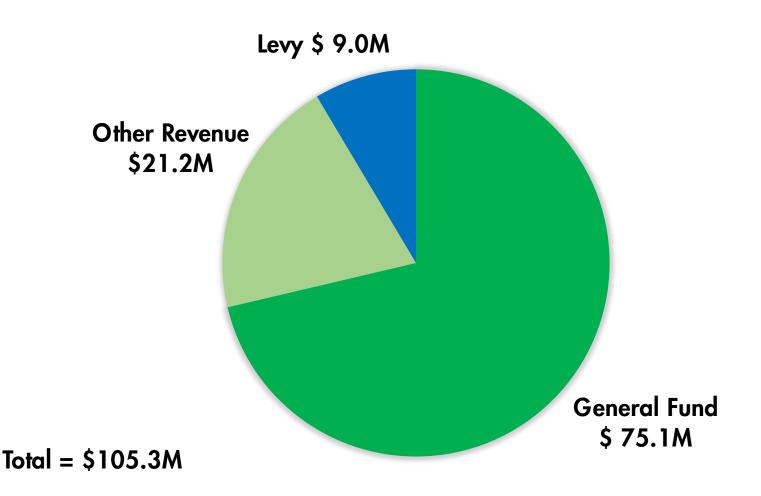
