Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

This legislation will be in the form of a fiscal year 2020-2021 grant in the amount of \$70,000 to CareOregon Inc. These funds will be primarily used for the development of the BHECN, which is a 24/7, triage and assessment unit that incorporates a network of services designed to meet the needs of individuals experiencing a behavioral health crisis. This legislation does not support or change any specific city policies.

Financial and budgetary impacts:

Funding for this grant is available in the FY 2020-21 adopted budget.

Community impacts and community involvement:

This legislation provides funding to CareOregon Inc to help create direct linkages to appropriate community resources such as detox, the Multnomah County Behavioral Health Resource Center, outpatient clinics, and FQHCs. Adding to the existing crisis continuum would be the development of a sub-acute unit that is inclusive of individuals with co-occurring substance use and physical health complexities that focuses on crisis stabilization and supporting transitions directly to the community.
