About the project

City staff are beginning to work with the community on a long-term plan for Brentwood-Darlington and portions of the Ardenwald-Johnson Creek, Lents, Mt. Scott-Arleta, and Woodstock neighborhoods. The plan process will rely on broad community input to identify neighborhood challenges and community assets. **The Lower Southeast Rising Area Plan will develop strategies to increase livability and housing stability**, as well as improve access to employment, businesses, and recreational opportunities.

Project purpose

The Lower Southeast Rising Area Plan will assess land use and transportation issues faced by community members in and around the area and identify possible solutions. This community-focused work will help:

- **Explore potential new neighborhood commercial and housing opportunities and ways to prevent displacement.**
- **Link affordable housing, economic development, and business stabilization opportunities.**
- **Enhance access to transit and pedestrian and bicycle network connectivity.**

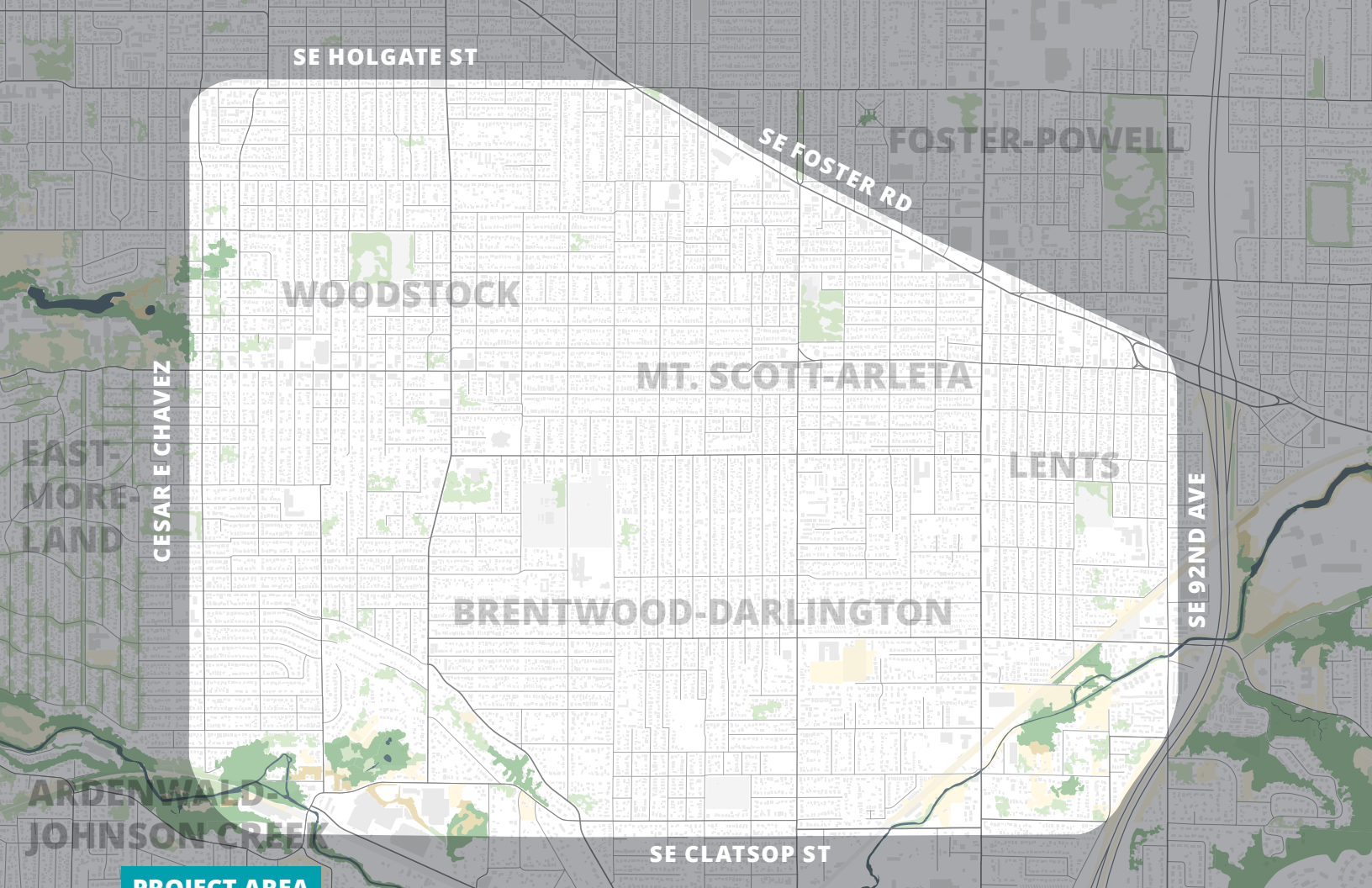
The final plan will consider potential zoning changes and develop implementation strategies related to transportation, land use, and community development.

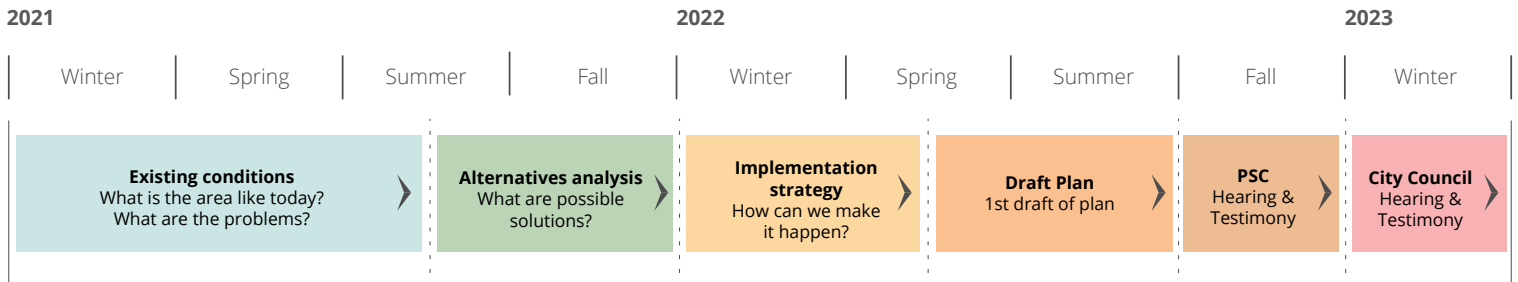

Project timeline

The development of the plan will last approximately 18 months, beginning in the spring of 2021 and concluding with adoption by City Council in early 2023.
