Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

Portland Fire and Rescue has requested the creation of a non-represented classification, Peer Support Specialist. The Specialist is a frontline first responder and peer, with lived experience in mental health issues and/or substance use. Duties include responding to non-emergency 911 behavioral / substance use / welfare check calls and following up with individuals to offer assistance navigating external agency services.

Creation of this classification will further the goals of the Portland Street Response program to:

- 1. Reduce the number of calls traditionally responded to by Police where criminal activity is not present.
- 2. Reduce the number of individuals transported to the emergency department for low acuity medical related issues that could instead be addressed in a pre-hospital care setting.
- 3. Reduce the number of behavioral health and lower acuity medical calls traditionally responded to by Police and Fire.

Financial and budgetary impacts:

There is no direct cost to create the new classification. Two Limited-Term Peer Support Specialist positions with a maximum annual salary of \$68,682 will be classified and funded in the Spring BMP.

Community impacts and community involvement:
