ORDINANCE No. 190332

Authorize a Subrecipient Grant Agreement to Community Cycling Center in the amount of \$20,000 for FY 2020-21 and FY 2021-22 for the Parkrose School District Safe Routes to School program (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The City of Portland is the recipient of \$80,000 funding passed through Metro Regional Transportation Options (RTO) Program from the Federal Transit Administration ("FTA") Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) and Surface Transportation Program (STP) grant funds from July 1, 2019 to July 31, 2022.

2. The RTO Program is designed to manage demand on the transportation system and increasing use of travel options. The Bureau of Transportation (PBOT) Active Transportation & Safety Division program and Parkrose School District (PSD) staff are collaborating over three school years to develop a set of multimodal programs that serve students at elementary and middle school, creating opportunities for students to develop transportation skills and confidence as part of their ongoing education during their time in the district.

3. A key component of the Parkrose School District Safe Routes project is a partnership with a non-profit for a total of \$20,000 from May 1, 2021 to July 31, 2022. This partnership will increase the project's ability to reach traditionally under-represented groups that the City of Portland is striving to provide opportunities to engage in active transportation. By combining City of Portland's demonstrated success in Safe Routes to School programming and the Community Cycling Center's skills in engaging and serving underserved communities plus their bike education expertise, the project will help provide opportunities for active transportation throughout the Parkrose School District in more equitable ways.

4. The Bureau's level of confidence in the cost estimates for this project is 100%.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. That the Commissioner-in-Charge is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with Community Cycling Center in a form similar to the contract attached as Exhibit A.
