
What is PCEF?

- Invests in climate action that advances racial and social justice
- Ballot measure passed by more than 65% of Portland
- First climate fund measure created and led by communities of color in the US.
- Generates \$40-60M annually for clean energy investments in Portland
- 1% gross receipts tax on sales in Portland by corporations with \$1B+ sales nationally and \$500M+ in Portland. Exemptions for things like groceries, utilities.






What is the role of the PCEF Committee?

- To make final funding recommendations to the City Council;
- To review our performance and report that performance to the public and City Council; and
- To make recommendations on changes to the PCEF code.

November 7, 2019 Council approves appointment of final four

December 11, 2019 Council amends PCEF code refining category of

entities who are subject to the Clean Energy

June 17, 2020 Council approves \$200k application support grant

program to support smaller BIPOC serving

organizations develop applications




PCEF grant public input process

PCEF RFP solicitation process





140 applications received


133 applications deemed eligible and technically feasible



Funding Authorization Request

- Mini-grants program: \$400,000


Total requested funding authorization: \$9,235,400
