Key Rate Factors



- Metro garbage tip fee increase
- More garbage, recycling, and food scraps/yard debris collected from households
- Higher fuel costs and wage increases

Proposed Monthly Rates

Primary Garbage Service Levels	Proposed Rate FY21-22	Rate Change	% Households Served*
35-Gallon - Every 4 Weeks	\$27.15	+ \$1.30	5%
20-Gallon	\$29.85	+ \$1.30	7%
35-Gallon	\$34.55	+ \$1.40	47%
60-Gallon	\$39.05	+ \$1.70	30%
90-Gallon	\$45.30	+ \$1.70	6%



^{*}About 5% of customers subscribe to other service levels
