ORDINANCE No. 190376

*Authorize Intergovernmental Agreement with Multnomah County Health Department and Portland Fire & Rescue to conduct COVID-19 Testing and Vaccinations (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. Portland Fire & Rescue (PF&R) is Oregon's largest fire and emergency services provider, providing an extensive range of public safety services.
- 2. PF&R's Community Health Assessment Team (CHAT) Program is committed to identifying social and behavioral determinates of health.
- 3. Multnomah County's Public Health Program establishes partnerships to promote and protect the health of all people in Multnomah County.
- 4. On February 28, 2020, the COVID-19 virus was confirmed in Oregon.
- 5. Multnomah County Public Health will provide geographic site for COVID-19 testing and vaccinations in collaboration with CHAT.
- 6. CHAT's COVID-19 Site Testing and Vaccination Program provides drive-through and walkup testing and vaccination sites that will lead to increased tracing, containment, and prevention of COVID-19.
- 7. The Program will focus on groups that are at a higher risk or disproportionately impacted by COVID-19.
- 8. Multnomah County will reimburse PF&R costs relating to the COVID-19 Testing and Vaccination Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. The Portland Fire & Rescue Chief is hereby authorized to execute an intergovernmental agreement with Multnomah County in a form substantially similar to the agreement attached as Exhibit A.

b. The Portland Fire & Rescue Chief is hereby authorized to authorized to execute, on behalf of the City, any subsequent amendments to the IGA unless the amendments increase the City's financial obligation under the agreement.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists in order to forward funds for services to begin vital COVID-19 vaccination and testing necessary to address an ongoing and immediate public health emergency. Therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
