ORDINANCE NO. 190405

Amend Fair Wage Policies Code to reflect current minimum wage rate index (Ordinance; amend Code Section 3.99.020)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. Chapter 3.99 of the Portland City Code regulates the City's Fair Wage Policies.
- 2. On May 13, 2015, City Council amended Portland City Code section 3.99.020, establishing the minimum wage for positions at the City of Portland and contracts for covered services shall be \$15.00 an hour. This section also includes the method The Office of Management and Finance applies to establish a yearly minimum wage.
- 3. This section of code is out-of-date. The Portland-Salem OR WA CPI-W is no longer published and is not available for the City Economist to calculate the yearly minimum wage.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

A. City Code Section 3.99.020 Adjustments is amended as set forth below:

The fiscal year 2015-16 State and Federal law sets the base minimum wage. Unless otherwise directed by Council, minimum wage shall be no less than \$15 per hour. The Office of Management and Finance shall provide City bureaus with a yearly minimum hourly wage rate for covered services which is anticipated to be
