

An Ordinance prohibiting the burial of deceased persons ^{within} in
the limits of the City of Portland after ~~June 30, 1892.~~ March 31/1892
Lone Fir Cemetery

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:

Section 1. After the 30th day of ^{March} June 1892, it shall be unlawful for ~~a~~
any person or persons to bury or cause or permit to be buried
in ^{any cemetery or in} any portion ~~of the~~ tract of ground situate in the City of
Portland, ~~known as Lone Fir Cemetery~~, the body of any deceased
person.

Section. 2. Every person convicted of a violation of any of the pro-
visions of this Ordinance shall pay a fine of not less than
one hundred dollars nor more than two hundred and fifty dol-
lars for each and every offence and in default of the payment
of such fine shall be imprisoned until such fine is paid,
such imprisonment, however, not to exceed sixty days on any
one conviction.
