An Ordinance calling a special municipal nonpartisan election to be held March 31, 1981 in the City of Portland for the purpose of submitting to the voters a measure authorizing issuance of serial general obligation bonds totaling not more than \$19,000,000 for the renovation, acquisition and construction of Performing Arts Facilities and such other Charter amendments or measures as the Council may find appropriate and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- The City Council did by resolution adopt on January 22, 1981, and submit to the legal voters of the City of Portland "a measure authorizing issuance of serial general obligation bonds totaling not more that \$19,000,000 for the renovation, acquisition and construction of Performing Arts Facilities.
- 2. Said measure is to be submitted to the voters at the special nonpartisan municipal election to be held in the City of Portland on March 31, 1981.
- 3. Resolution No. 32817 adopted by the Council November 26, 1980 provided that a special election was called for March 31, 1981 only in the event that a candidate for the position of the office of City Commissioner of the City of Portland, Position No. 3 was not filled by the election of a candidate at the prior February 17, 1981 election.
- 4. It is necessary to call a special municipal election by the City of Portland on Tuesday, March 31, 1981 for the purpose of submitting "a measure authorizing issuance of general serial obligation bonds totaling not more than \$19,000,000 dollars for the renovation, acquisition and construction of Performing Art Facilities and such other Charter amendments or measures as the Council may find appropriate;

NOW, THEREFORE, The Council directs:

a. A special municipal election hereby is called to be held in the City of Portland on Tuesday, March 31, 1981 for the purpose of submitting to the voters of the City of Portland "a measure authorizing issuance of serial general obligation bonds totaling not more than \$19,000,000 for the renovation, acquisition and construction of Performing Arts Facilities and such other Charter amendments or measures as the Council may find appropraite;"

- b. That such special election is hereby called whether or not such election date is necessary to elect a candidate for the position of City Commissioner of the City of Portland, Position No. 3 by virtue of a run-off election required after the prior special municipal election of February 17, 1981 all as set forth in Resolution No. 32817 adopted by the Council November 26, 1980.
- c. The Auditor of the City of Portland hereby is authorized and directed to provide for the printing of such special election ballots as are necessary and to provide such election supplies for the City as are necessary for the proper carrying on of the election and to provide for the delivery of the same to the same election boards for which provision is hereinafter made.
- d. The polling places for such election or elections in the City of Portland shall be as determined and provided for by the Registrar of Elections of Multnomah County and the County Clerk of Clackamas County and the Director of Records and Elections of Washington County and the judges and clerks shall be appointed as required by law.
- e. Said special municipal election shall be held in accordance with the laws of the State of Oregon. The polls shall be open at the hour of 8:00 a.m. in the forenoon and shall continue open until 8:00 p.m. in the evening of the same day at which time the polls shall be closed.
- f. The Auditor of the City of Portland hereby is directed to give notice of such special election in the manner prescribed by law.
- g. The election shall be conducted as provided by law, and the ballots shall be counted, tabulated and returned to the Registrar of Elections of Multnomah County at 1040 SE Morrison Street in Portland, to the County Clerk of Clackamas County at the Clackamas County Courthouse in Oregon City, and to the Director or Records and Elections of Washington County at the Washington County Courthouse in Hillsboro, and the vote shall be canvassed and details of the election handled as provided for in State statutes pertaining thereto.

ORDINANCE No.

- h. The Auditor of the City of Portland hereby is authorized to incur expenses necessary and incident to the carrying on of such special election.
- Section 2. The Council declares an emergency exists because it is necessary to give notice of the special election called herein and to make timely arrangements for such special election; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
