Testimony to Portland City Council on the Design Overlay Zone Amendments, Recommended Draft

My name is Miriam Erb Aragon, I'm Hispanic and have lived in the Sellwood-Moreland neighborhood for 8 years. I was a board member of the neighborhood association for 4 years and now work with the Land Use Committee. I believe the SMILE neighborhood association has made our community more fair, more diverse, and more willing to work together to deal with change and growth, rather than encourage factions to oppose each other. It is through our neighborhood association that we have made our Board diverse and representative by actively seeking people of different backgrounds and experiences. We have representatives of homeowners and renters, of different ethnicities, and of different economic backgrounds. We have welcomed the building of affordable housing and a homeless shelter in our area. Sellwood-Moreland's feel of a small town is in part because of its main streets and we feel that asking new development to value architectural standards and incorporate some of them in their new construction is not only respectful of our history but smart so that Portland neighborhoods can grow and absorb density while still having that livability that is so critical in our city today.
