# Grant Agreement #32001994 Semi-Annual report January 2021-June 2021 Final REPORT

Central Northeast Neighbors (CNN) is a 501(c) 3 community based nonprofit coalition of nine Neighborhood Associations and organizations. Including Beaumont Wilshire, Cully, Grant Park, Hollywood, Madison South, Rose City Park, Roseway, Sumner, Sunderland and Dignity Village. Our CNN Board of Directors is made up of volunteer representatives from each.

CNN provides support and technical assistance to volunteer based Neighborhood Associations and Dignity Village, Community Groups, Business Associations and individuals. CNN coalition acts as a forum to support and strengthen communities to take action on issues they identify. We support community driven activities that contribute to livability, inclusiveness, equity, diversity, safety, and housing.

#### **Grant Purposes**

The purpose of this Agreement is to advance the City's goal of supporting the creation of "a framework by which the people of the City of Portland may effectively participate in civic affairs and work to improve the livability and character of their Neighborhoods and the City." BWNA's Friends of Wilshire Park (FoWP) committee along with many volunteers assisted



Portland Parks & Recreation (PP&R) in planting over 200 native in Wilshire Park, NE 33 and Skidmore. FoWP is working with PP&R to on a project that would provide water for the off-leash dog area. Upon PP&R approval (hopefully), the committee will kick off a fundraising campaign, utilizing this newsletter to publicize the project to neighbors and solicit donations. Future project ideas include installation of a FoWP billboard in the park,

seating to the toddler area, play equipment for older children, restoring the splash pad, and fencing the dog area. The committee invites the public to weigh in on these proposals, suggest new ones and become volunteers. **BWNA joins forces with Beaumont Middle School in lending a hand to needy families**. Many of the usual BWNA projects have been put on hold due to the coronavirus. Given the economic hardships and job losses caused by pandemic-induced shutdowns, the board sought a way to help struggling families in the local community. BWNA reached out to Beaumont Middle School Principal Harriette Vimegnon, asking if she knew families of students who could use some extra help. She responded immediately and enthusiastically, explaining that the school was working

with a Portland nonprofit to help with food resources, but wondered if BWNA might be able to supply gift cards to help with other household necessities, such as hygiene products, supplies for infants (e.g., formula and diapers), and other items. Counselors and teachers at the school and other community partners would collaborate in selecting recipients and disseminating the cards. The BWNA welcomed Ms. Vimegnon's proposal. The project got a boost from BWNA's umbrella organization, Central Northeast Neighbors (CNN)—a coalition of nine local neighborhood associations (NAs), encouraging them to use the funds for coronavirus relief efforts, but with no particular restrictions. BWNA tapped into funding the board had set aside for participation in this year's Beaumont Middle School's Sparrow Project, which raises money to assist seriously handicapped kids. (This project was postponed to 2021-22 academic year. BWNA board approved \$1,500 worth of \$50 Fred Meyer gift cards. Principal Vimegnon wrote, "We are very appreciative of your support... Our first three cards were given out this morning! The needs are definitely there, your support will be greatly appreciated. We are grateful to work in a community that supports its neighbors. It is because of organizations like yours that we as Oregonians are able to thrive." <u>https://app.memberhub.gives/beaumontbobcats</u>

(Side note: this is what Portland's all-volunteer neighborhood associations do. This is what neighborhoods are for.) CNN Executive Director Alison Stoll reported that other NAs in the coalition have used the coronavirus relief allotments in a variety of ways, including matching SNAP (food stamp) funding at the Hollywood Farmers Market (thus supporting families as well as local farmers and entrepreneurs), distributing masks and hand sanitizers for neighbors in need, and providing basics for the homeless.

#### The Rose City ParkPlayground Project (RCPPP)

has entered its third year. Over the last three years the project has raised just over \$14,000, mostly from generous family contributions from RCP residents. COVID-19 made 2020 a challenging year for fundraising and building awareness, as all events had to be cancelled in support of the project.

The RCPPP has faced significant obstacles to bringing this dream to reality. Although COVID-19 has impacted fundraising, our greatest hurdle has been gaining substantive support from the City of Portland and Portland Parks and Recreation. They support our initiative and appreciate our efforts to pull the community together to renovate the park, but have been unwilling to provide any financial or political support to help complete the project.

RCPPP is currently working to schedule a meeting with new Parks Commissioner Carmen Rubio to share the RCPPP story, its accomplishments and challenges. RCPPP hopes to gain support

and start setting goals to bring this project to completion. A commitment of support from Portland Parks and Recreation will be a critical first step towards building our new playground.

The project will no longer be taking donations until firm support and funding details are set by the city to meet our goals. <u>rosecityparkplaygroundproject@gmail.com</u>. ## **CNN Resiliency grant funds**

**Beaumont Wilshire NA** started a "green" community assistance initiative. The grantor, Central Northeast Neighbors (CNN), the umbrella organization for BWNA and eight other area neighborhood associations, made \$1,000 grants available to help local populations impacted by the pandemic, and it was Sam (a local neighbor) who suggested consideration of



"Community Cycling Center—Pedals to the People," located at the corner of NE 17th Avenue and Alberta Street, the nonprofit with an array of bicycle-related outreach programs, one of which solicits donations of food and miscellaneous hygiene items (i.e., Care Kits) for delivery by bicycle courier to those in need. With CNN's grant application date fast approaching, President Tim Gillespie convened a special meeting of the board to evaluate prospective recipients, and Community Cycling Center emerged as the unanimous choice. Upon awarding the grant to BWNA, Sam rode his bike to the Community Cycling Center to participate in the presentation of the check, dedicated to funding Care Kits. #### **Beaumont Wilshire NA**

As we worked with the staff at the Community Cycling Center, we learned that this worthwhile project has relied on the mostly-volunteer labor of a group of workers dubbed the ABC team, which is for Andando en Bicicletas y Caminando ("Riding on Bicycles and Walking"). CCC describes those critical helpers as "a group of low-income, immigrant, BIPOC community members who work to further active transportation, largely in the Cully area. Throughout the pandemic, their support has been critical in our food delivery operations." Each Friday, this group gathers to help assemble hundreds of food boxes and Care Kits before they are delivered.

The CCC staff proposes that we contribute this additional grant to the ABC group's discretionary funds, which typically have gone toward things that reduce barriers to participation in events—for example, providing child care to folks who otherwise would not be able to attend group events, providing meals at events, etc. Over time, this could even help to expand ABC as a

group, as the biggest issue for expansion is cost; group members are provided a modest stipend each month for their volunteer time to offset some of the financial barriers that traditional volunteering poses.

We at BWNA have seen the Community Cycling Center's success at pivoting from their core mission of supporting the healthy transportation alternative of bicycling to demonstrating that bicycles can be used to deliver compassionate needs-based services to those especially struggling during the Covid crisis. We have been impressed with the aim and delivery of that program--and in particular the way CCC has enlisted targeted community members in participating in this program. In all these ways, we see this endeavor as meeting the equity goals expressed in Portland's EquityToolkit for Covid-19 Relief and Recovery Efforts.

Hollywood Neighborhood Association used \$1000 in Resiliency Grant Funds for 2



projects within their Neighborhood.

\$500 to the Hollywood Farmers Market for the S.N.A.P. program. This fund assisted in providing those with limited income funds to purchase fresh, high quality, and healthy foods. \$1000 for Mother and Child Education Center to assist in installing a vegetable garden on their business site. This garden will provide an opportunity to teach

their clients some basic skills

that would allow them to provide fresh fruit and vegetables for their families. Portland Nursery offered a 30% discount and 2 custom made garden boxes are being donated to Mother and Child from a neighbor.



**Madison South Neighborhood Association** Donated to \$250 to McDaniel High School and Jason Lee school. McDaniel's program offers emergency support for groceries, utility bills, to help with rent, etc. \$500 went to the Beach Street Garden. The garden donates food grown to the houseless through the Main Street Food Program.

The COVID-19 pandemic continues as a major influence on everything. Mandatory quarantining and rules about gatherings is difficult as the county and state rules keep changing. Cancelling and rescheduling meetings with many to be virtual and online. Some neighbors do not have internet or computers. And many times technical difficulties continue to be a problem. It is always a pleasure to work with volunteers and find creative ways for them to connect. Almost all of our work continues online, on cell phone and virtual. During this time our CNN / Fire Station Community Room is still being used by the Fire Bureau and remains closed to the public. The entire Fire Station building is still closed to the community and this includes our CNN office. We continue to work with all of our community for their needs specific to the Pandemic and everyday challenges. As a 501(c)3 nonprofit we are challenged with our funding and continue to look for more grant and partnership opportunities. One of our major projects Neighborhood Cleanups lost all funding from the City of Portland and Metro and we would love to see this partnership re-established and funded. Outside grant funding is scarce and we are actively looking for grant monies for this and many other projects. Much of our work these 6 months have been finding resources for neighbors who are isolated and have food and income insecurities. Our staff is beginning to have office hours back in our CNN office.

We look forward to establishing more open communications with the city of Portland as we all begin to work a new normal.
