

What is the TSP?

- Local: TSP is a 20-year plan that guides transportation policies and investments. It is an element of the Comprehensive Plan.
- Region: It is consistent with the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP)
- State: It complies with the Transportation Planning Goal 12 and the Transportation Planning Rule.

Portland's TSP History

- 2002: First TSP Adopted
- 2007: Minor update to Master Street Plans
- 2016-18: Adopted in 3 stages in coordination with Comprehensive Plan update & Periodic Review
- 2020: Minor update to classifications, projects, and policies

- Dozens of policies that guide the maintenance, development, and implementation of Portland's transportation system.
- Performance measures & targets
- Provides the policy framework for decision-making


Street Classifications

- Provide policy guidance for the desired function of streets for each mode of travel:
 - Pedestrian
 - Bicycle
 - Street Design
 - Emergency Response
 - Traffic
 - Transit
 - Freight



Master Street Plans

- •Provide guidance for location of future street, bicycle, and pedestrian connectivity.
- •16 master street plans referenced in TSP



Modal Plans

- References adopted modal plans:
 - PedPDX
 - •2030 Bicycle Plan
 - Freight Master Plan
 - •Enhanced Transit Corridors & Growing Transit Communities Plans







Implementation Strategies

 A list of future studies and refinement plans that have been identified by city, region, and state.

• Feeds into transportation planning's work plan & planning grants opportunities

Major Projects and Programs

•A list of significant projects with anticipated timelines for completion (1-10 years, 11-20, years, unconstrained)

•10 TSP Programs that complete system gaps

Tied to financial chapter



Requirements of Next TSP Update

- Planning horizon must be changed
- Financial chapter must be updated to show resources to implement the plan
- Major projects list needs to be updated to be consistent with finances
- Must be consistent with Comprehensive Plan, Regional Transportation Plan, State requirements
- Considerations of recommendations from Council-adopted plans
