ORDINANCE NO. 151379<sup>a</sup>

An Ordinance granting a revocable permit to the Portland Rose Festival Association to vend and sell rose pins on the City sidewalks, beginning on May 15, 1981, and ending on June 14, 1981, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The Portland Rose Festival Association has through Clayton Hannon, Executive Manager, applied for permission to vend and sell rose pins on the sidewalks of the City of Portland.
2. The sale of rose pins is an annual Rose Festival activity.
3. The granting of the said permission, under certain conditions, will not be detrimental to the public interest.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. a revocable permit is granted to the Portland Rose Festival Association to vend and sell rose pins on downtown sidewalks beginning on May 15, 1981, and ending June 14, 1981, subject to the following conditions:
  - (1) The permittee shall hold the City of Portland, its officers, agents, and employees free and harmless from any claims for damages to persons or property, including legal fees and costs of defending any actions or suits, including any appeals which may result from the use of the street area under this permit by providing evidence of insurance protecting the City of Portland, its officers, agents, and employees as follows:  
Bodily injury \$100,000 for one claimant and \$300,000 for one occurrence, property damage \$50,000 for one claimant and \$300,000 for one occurrence, said insurance to be kept in full force and effect at all times. This permit is automatically revoked without further action by the Council if this insurance is permitted to lapse, is cancelled or, for any other reason, becomes inoperative.

Section 2. This Ordinance will not become effective until the permittee has filed with the City Auditor a document, which has been approved by the City Attorney, accepting the terms and conditions hereof. This Ordinance shall be automatically revoked without further consideration by the Council if the terms and conditions are not accepted within sixty (60) calendar days of the passage of this Ordinance.


**ORDINANCE No.**

Section 3. The Council declares that an emergency exists because delay in the enactment of this Ordinance will result in an unnecessary hardship of uncertainty on the part of the applicant as to the status of the requested permit to vend and sell rose pins during the Rose Festival; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
