ORDINANCE NO. 151380

An Ordinance granting a revocable pennit to the Portland Rose Festival Association to erect and maintain flags and banners on the ornamental light standards in downtown Portland from May 23rd through June 21st, 1981, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Portland Rose Festival Association, through Clayton Hannon, Executive Manager, has applied for pennission to erect and maintain flags and banners on the ornamental light standards in downtown Portland from May 23rd through June 21st, 1981.
- 2. That said placing of flags and banners during the Rose Festival is a tradition that should be continued.
- That the granting of said permission under certain conditions, will not be detrimental to the public interest.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. A revocable permit hereby is granted to the Portland Rose Festival Association, permittee, to erect and maintain flags and banners on the ornamental light standards in downtown Portland from May 23rd through June 21st, 1981, subject to the following conditions:
 - (1) This permit is for the use of the street area only and shall not exempt the permittee from obtaining any license or permit required by the City Code, or Ordinances for any act to be performed under this permit, nor shall this permit waive the provisions of any City Code, Ordinance, or the City Charter except as herein stated.
 - (2) Flags and banners must be located so as to have a minimum clearance of 11 feet above the roadway of the street and the approval for the use of the light standards and the manner of securing the flags and banners must be obtained from the utility companies involved.
 - (3) This permit is revocable at any time in the event the public's need requires it and no expenditure of money hereunder, lapse of time, or other act or thing shall operate as an estoppel against the City of Portland, or be held to give the permittee any vested or other right. Immediately upon the expiration of this permit, or upon its sooner revocation by the Council, the permittee shall remove said, flags and banners from the street area as directed by and to the satisfaction of the City Engineer.

ORDINANCE No.

- (4) The permittee shall hold the City of Portland, its officers, agents, and employees free and harmless from any claims for damages to persons or property, including legal fees and costs of defending any actions or suits, including any appeals which may result from the use of the street area under this permit by providing evidence of insurance protecting the City of Portland, its officers, agents, and employees as follows:

 Bodily injury \$100,000 for one claimant and \$300,000 for one occurrence, property damage \$50,000 for one claimant and \$300,000 for one occurrence, said insurance to be kept in full force and effect at all times. This permit is automatically revoked without further action by the Council if this insurance is permitted to lapse, is cancelled or, for any other reason, becomes inoperative.
- Section 2. This Ordinance will not become effective until the permittee has filed with the City Auditor a document, which has been approved by the City Attorney, accepting the terms and conditions hereof. This Ordinance shall be automatically revoked without further consideration by the Council if the terms and conditions are not accepted within sixty (60) calendar days of the passage of this Ordinance.
- Section 3. The Council declares that an emergency exists because delay in the enactment of this Ordinance will result in an unnecessary hardship of uncertainty on the part of the applicant as to the status of the requested permit to erect and maintain flags and banners on the ornamental light standards; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
