## Testimony to **Portland City Council** on the **Shelter to Housing Continuum Project**, **Recommended Draft**

This new revenue, which the City of Portland will collect for Metro, should permit local governments to develop much better solutions for homelessness without turning our beautiful parks into blighted green spaces.
