Not everyone has a yard of their own. Our parks are the only access to nature and the outdoors that some have. No one should call our parks home but everyone should be able to feel safe in them. I do not envy you for the difficult problems you are trying to solve for all of us but I urge you to think hard and long on this as I believe solving a problem for one population in this case will have a serious effect on the lives of many others.
