The homeless dilemma is a challenge for us all, both public and private and requires a partnership between many parties and of course the homeless themselves, at least thise that want help and are willing to participate in solving the problems. I support removal of current open spaces/zones from consideration for either temporary or permanent homeless shelters as an amendment to the S2HC Recommendations. and to amend the language in the new provision 33.296.030.H to add an exception for the Open Space Zone. Maybe such a proposal, as being considered, should be considered in planning new open spaces to address all the required infrastructure and funding. hanks for your consideration.
