I support the **Shelter to Housing Continuum**. It is an important step to making temporary shelter available to all in Portland who need it, and allows more types of permanent housing.

- The proposal lowers barriers to siting shelters and services.
- It expands the definition of Group Living, allowing more folks to live in these facilities, including SRO apartments, and co-housing.
- It gives permanent status to outdoor shelters owned by public agencies and nonprofits, such as Kenton Women's Village.
- It allows a single RV or a Tiny House on Wheels on a residential property.

Each of these proposals has been used successfully before.

I ask you to adopt this proposal, and to go further and adopt three more policy changes, that are suggested by the Social Justice Coalition:

- 1. Remove the ban on Outdoor Shelters in Open Space (OS) zones, and in Rights-of-Way. OS zoning includes many usable spaces along the edge of highways or under bridges. Require any shelter located in Open Space to be approved by a case-by-case City Council vote, to ensure that only appropriate sites are authorized.
- 2. Allow RVs and Tiny Houses on Wheels to locate in Residential zones, and to use alternative sanitation solutions such as pumping services, rather than requiring an expensive hard-piped sewer hookup, which can cost thousands of dollars.
- 3. Allow churches, other faith-based organizations and Community non-profits to site Outdoor Shelters on their properties in Low-density Residential Zones.

Adopting the proposal with these changes will make a world of difference for the most unfortunate of our neighbors, and give them a start on the path to stability.
