

Amanda Fritz Additional Testimony 3/17/21

1. Do not require RVs where people live on private property to have sewer hookups or even “campground standards”. Residents who allow people to live in an RV on their property will ensure the black and gray water is either pumped or driven for disposal at free roadside hookups available close to Portland.
2. Allow people to live in RVs in the front setback.
3. There is a solution to the concern about allowing temporary Outdoor Shelters in parks and natural areas. Prohibit even temporary Outdoor Shelters on properties owned by Portland Parks & Recreation, the Portland Water Bureau, and the Bureau of Environmental Services, or on trails identified on the adopted Citywide Trails map.
4. Obviously, this should not apply to temporary shelters in Community Centers, and the Code can be written that way.
5. Allow the City Council to approve even permanent Outdoor Shelters on other OS zoned properties, perhaps even on the PPR, PWB and BES.
6. Require a Good Neighbor Agreement process for all Outdoor Shelters, perhaps instead of the Conditional Use land use review. Conversations and collaboration with the surrounding Lloyd community has been crucial to the success of Right 2 Dream Too.
