Testimony to **Portland City Council** on the **Shelter to Housing Continuum Project**, **Recommended Draft**

We have a housing emergency. However, instead of further fueling the divide between sympathetic folks who want the City to do more, and those folks who see people without housing as a nuisance, please consider this: Parks are a highly symbolic and visual product of the neighborhood. Taking something meant for child's play, a bench to onlook, a spot to eat lunch, a respite from the indoors—using parks, instead of vacant buildings or parking lots both alienates neighbors and frustrates advocates; the former because they now cannot their children out, and the latter because a semi-permanent shanty is NOT humane housing for people. This is the kind of project that offers an oversimplified solution to a complex problem: we need money, land, and compassion to fix this. Redirecting park use, removing outdoor space for kids who already spend all day on Zoom, frustrating neighbors, fueling divides, while *still* not providing an ethical option for housing....seems both impractical and imprudent. Please reconsider this. Thank you. —A Lair Hill resident who takes her toddler to Lair Hill Park almost daily.
