I took my then preschool aged granddaughter to the indoor park which was a highlight her. Her social skills grew from the time she spent there. I hope to take our grandson as well. The Gabriel Park complex is a very positive asset for our area. I am particularly concerned about the wooded area and use of fire by the campers. Fire would ruin this special area of the park. Folks use the paths through the Park as a path to access Multnomah Bl. due to the lack of sidewalks in the area. Walkers frequently use the wooded area as part of their routine walks. Seeing camp areas around the city reflects the disrespect for property. Garbage and trash as well as unsanitary conditions would create unhealthy conditions for those using the park, particularly for families with younger children. Has the council considered using the former Sears Center on Multnomah Bl. for serving the homeless? I drive by it regularly and see the empty parking lot.
