

IMPACT STATEMENT

Legislation title: *Authorize the Director of the Bureau of Emergency Management to execute 2021 Community Resilience Project grant agreements in amount not to exceed \$100,000 (Ordinance)

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Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

- This ordinance authorizes the Director of the Portland Bureau of Emergency Management (PBEM) to execute \$100,000 in grant agreements to the 2021 Community Resilience Project.
- The goals of this project are to provide community-based organizations with funding to support the development or enhancement of trainings, tools, and/or plans; provide organizational development; and/or develop other resources to enhance their capacity as critical partners before, during, and after disasters.
- Individual grants to community-based organizations will not exceed \$25,000. Projects are expected to start in January 2022 and should last up to 18 months.
- A community-based task force conducted a two-phase selection process for awarding funds and selected seven organizations.

Financial and budgetary impacts:

This legislation has no financial and/or budgetary impacts. Funding for the 2021 Community Resilience Project is supported by the Regional Disaster Preparedness Organization locally contributed funds. There are enough funds available to support these community-based grants.

Community impacts and community involvement:

Grantees and the communities they serve will be better prepared for emergencies through the funded projects.
