Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

- The Addendum to the Settlement Agreement between the US Department of Justice (DOJ) and the City includes remedies for the DOJ findings of non-compliance issued in April 2021.
- Following the dispute resolution process provided in the Settlement Agreement, nine remedies were reached through mediation to address the DOJ's concerns.
- After Council adoption, the U.S. District Court will set a fairness hearing and invite comment from the amici and community before deciding whether to approve the Addendum.

Financial and budgetary impacts:

On November 17, 2021, the City Council approved Ordinance 190606, adopting the FY 2021-22 Fall Supplemental Budget, which provided funding during this fiscal year for the proposed remedies included in this amendment. As noted in the prior ordinance, several of the remedies include on-going reforms that will affect Current Appropriation Level and future budgets, including for such items as the implementation of body worn cameras and the new civilian leader of all educational aspects of PPB's Training Division.

Community impacts and community involvement:

The remedies included in the Addendum to the Settlement Agreement are designed to further the City and DOJ's goals of improving policing and increase community safety, in particular by examining and reducing the use of force in policing. The remedies will be subject to a fairness hearing in U.S. District Court, and the Addendum specifically requires community engagement as the City develops a program for body-worn cameras.
