Summary of comments on proposed amendments

Commissioners generally agreed with the direction for all proposed amendments. Specific comments made by commissioners are noted below:

- One commissioner commented on Amendment 1, General, and the framework map, finding it difficult to figure out on which streets the Green Ring is located and asked if it would be possible to place some street names on that map.
- Regarding Amendment 2, Background, commissioners all agreed that proposed revisions to the language are appropriate since they were made based on conversations with Indigenous community members.
- Regarding Amendment 3, Map Diagram & Caption, commissioners reiterated their desire to see some reference points added to the framework map for the Green Loop, though they also do not want those additions to complicate the map.
- Commissioners had no specific comments regarding Amendments 5, Community Character, or 6, Architecture & Urban Design.
- Regarding Amendment 7, Natural & Scenic Resources, one commissioner asked that the terms for Green Ring and Green Loop are used consistently and not interchangeably. Another commissioner asked that the term “Green Lung” be added to the glossary.
