# Authorize a three-year Intergovernmental Agreement with Oregon State University to partner on projects and programs related to wastewater, stormwater, and watershed health not to exceed \$450,000

**Passed** 

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- The Bureau of Environmental Services (BES) manages Portland's wastewater and stormwater infrastructure to protect public health and the environment.
- 2. BES's 10-Year Strategic Plan 2018-2027 outlines the vision to be a mission-driven, high-performance organization, leading the City in preserving and restoring the health of Portland's watersheds.
- 3. To achieve the mission and vision of BES, we need to rely on cutting edge science and strong partnerships in the community and between bureaus.
- 4. Oregon State University (OSU) and BES have a mutual interest in advancing science and partnerships.
- 5. BES is interested in entering into an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with OSU to provide research, technical assistance, data collection and analysis, design, education and outreach, and facilitation services.
- 6. BES would provide funding to OSU at the Bureau's own discretion and dependent on its priorities and available funding.
- 7. Under this agreement, OSU and BES will engage in projects according to Task Orders that specify a scope of work, deliverables and compensation.
- 8. The established cost is \$450,000 over a three year period.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

A. The Director of the Bureau of Environmental Services is authorized to enter into an agreement with Oregon State University in a form
