Background

The MHCRC is a quasi-governmental body, created by Intergovernmental Agreement, to develop and regulate cable services franchise agreements and manage public benefit resources and assets related to the agreements. The MHCRC reports to the City Councils of Portland, Gresham, Troutdale, Wood Village and Fairview, and the Multnomah County Commission. The City of Portland has three (3) seats on this eightmember, five-jurisdiction intergovernmental body.

These positions have been vacant since the resignations of previous appointees, Kory Murphy and Vincent (Walle) Brown and who resigned their respective terms on the Commission in December 2021.
