Can you provide a missing persons case number?

In the first week of February 2022 my girlfriend informed me that a very close and dear friend of hers, Aaron, had gone missing and that his family and friends had not heard from him. Aaron and my partner have known each other for years after he had helped her to escape a dangerous and life-threatening domestic violence situation. Those of us who know the situation believe that Aaron saved my girlfriend's life. As with any of us, with the thought of a close friend being in trouble, cold, hungry, hurt, or worse it sent us immediately searching through the normal avenues to help find our friend. My girlfriend began reaching out to local police departments. I remember her telling me that there was a case number and that the case was ongoing, but that there was a lack of 'steam' due to the fact that Aaron had no previously documented mental health or medical history that would cause the case to be prioritized further. We knew after speaking with family that he began to show signs and 'red-flags' of mental health issues just prior to his disappearance. I was told that some of these behavioral signs pointed to the real possibility of late-onset schizophrenia, supposedly known to be a disorder his father has. Friends from as far as Illinois gathered in Portland to begin looking for Aaron. People with autism, people with ADHD, PTSD, a military veteran with a TBI who just got out of the hospital, recovering from surgery. The group of us who began looking for him knew the dangers of how someone with this disorder can be for a person who isn't medicated and supported. We became scared for Aaron and without much contact or help from police, and while working multiple day jobs, we started to mobilize on our own. Using our own finances to purchase posters and flyers, tape and staple-guns, flyer-sleeves, and transit tickets. It was exhausting looking for Aaron. For days we met downtown, fanning out in cars and on trains. We spoke to many people, anyone who would look at his poster or listen to our worries. After our first couple of ventures looking for our lost friend, we quickly learned that much of the time spent looking for Aaron was also having to organize who we had contacted, who we needed to follow-up with, keeping in contact with the investigators who were assigned to Aarons case, adding even more to our work load. In that time we called shelters, contacted news outlets, and spoke to as many people as we could about our missing friend. Many said that they would keep an eye out and a few said they thought they may have seen Aaron. Giving up our free time after work and weekends was taxing, both physically and emotionally.

Then the moment all of us had been waiting and praying for. Almost one month since Aaron had gone missing, Someone at Bybee Lake Center saw one of our posters and called us about a person staying in their facility who matched Aaron's description. We were ecstatic, but hesitant, to feel into our elief after previous false positives. With hearts filled and after many sleepless nights, we set eyes on our missing friend. It really was Aaron! However, quickly emotions of relief, joy, and resolution gave way to confusion, disappointment and anger as we learned that it was Tigard police that had discovered Aaron and physically brought him to the Bybee facility. It was the Tigard police who had discovered him, not the Portland police investigating his case. And while we spent our days, nights, weekends and the last scraps of energy that we had to search for Aaron, he had already been found, but still left 'missing'. Again, why is it that people dealing with challenges on a good day had to come together to find him? People from as far as Illinois, 4 days across the country, came together to ask people on the street, Join PDX, warming shelters, people on transit and at stops face to face if they had seen him.

I don't understand how or why Aaron wasn't identified as a missing person at the point of contact with law enforcement officers. That information should have not just been identified but also given to the departments in charge of his missing persons case. I cannot understand how these departments, so close to one another, either aren't willing or able to have that communication. It took days for Aaron to be found after he was brought to Bybee Lake Center. Days that could have been spent helping Aaron seek mental health services as well as other support to reduce the chances of him having another mental crisis, possibly avoiding injury or becoming lost again. To me it's simple: There should be a system in place to label a person as missing, a database that is queried when a person who's missing is identified and both departments should be alerted of this discovery. This sounds like something obvious to me, and if it is standard procedure, why did it not happen here? A missing persons database to be able to cross-reference identified people should exist to allow anyone from any department who may use this system to make that discovery and get that person the help they need.

My son was missing for a month. He disappeared while suffering from mental health issues due to trauma. I'm writing in hopes of bringing awareness to the lack of police support in this matter. They did little to nothing to search for my son. I'm sure there are countless others in the same situation.

I had last spoke with my son 01/27/2022, the next day his phone was going directly to voicemail and no reply to any texts. He was staying with one of my other sons at the time and they had an argument on the 27th. He left on foot with his backpack & guitar. After not being able to contact him for a week, I became very concerned for his safety. After calling a list of hospitals, I filed a missing persons report with the Clackamas county police dept. Police said since he's an adult all they can do is notify me if he reaches out to them, or they come across him. if a different police dept comes across him, they may just simply close the case and not contact me, it is at the officer's discretion. I asked if they could locate where his phone is (that I own), but they said no and referred me to my phone carrier.

I called Apple and my phone carrier twice, and due to privacy laws, they couldn't ping his phone to get a location without police authorization.

I called the police again on 02/13/2022 and asked the officer handling the case if they would be able to tell where his EBT card was last used, so we would at least know the area he may be in for me & my son to search, but she said they don't have access to that type of info.

Feeling helpless, hopeless and afraid for Aaron, I asked my two sons to post something on Face Book. Within no time friends and strangers were all sharing the post and actively looking for him. One of Aaron's best friends messaged me and created a missing persons flyer & video which has also been distributed on multiple social media platforms. Two of his other close friends drive across county from Illinois to help search for Aaron together. The three of them hung & passed out flyers in Portland and surrounding towns, Beaverton, hillsboro, Gresham and including numerous trimet stops. They were actively out in the icy weather day after day for hours, joined by another friend, who was also very concerned for my sons safety & well being. I am so great full for all of the love & support. At the same time am very disheartened and frustrated with the police not being able to use resources to at least locate the phone My son is using. I reached out to the Clackamas county officer again 02/25/2022 and I let her know how much loved ones are doing to search for him and asked again if they could locate his phone (that I own)- because the carrier won't do so without law enforcement involved. I also asked about accessing Trimet footage.

The officer said there is nothing more they can do at this point. They have to meet a certain criteria, and the phone carrier should be able to help me if I own the phone and that they can't just ping peoples phones every time someone requests it and cant sit there & monitor TriMet footage daily. She also said he's probably not missing and may be hanging out in a homeless camp. Because he was found walking out of a homeless camp by Washington county police after he disappeared for 3 days in November, from my home in Tigard. I was very great full to Washington county police for their efforts. I know they actually searched for him.

The Clackamas county officer did mention that they could request dental records after 30 days...but that's from the time I filed the report which was 02/06/2022.

Aaron was found 02/27/2022 after his friends from out of state received a call from Bybee Hope Center. He had been staying there for a week after sleeping in the streets from the time of his disappearance. He has suffered further emotional Trama as a result of these events, but is now seeking help, thanks to loved ones friends and citizens who stepped up to the task, where the police did not. Aaron was found within a week of his friends arriving from Illinois, but could've been found a lot sooner with support from the police.

My wife and I drove from Illinois to Portland to help find a friend of ours who had gone missing. His mother had filed a missing person report, but had received no help from Portland police.

The first thing we did was contact Verizon to see if a family member on his plan could obtain information as to whether his phone was active, just to make sure he was alive. Verizon told us that they have a team for this purpose, but they can only work with law enforcement. The Portland police told our friend's mother that she would not be informed even if her son were located alive because being missing isn't a crime.

While we were in town and visiting places we thought our friend may have gone to feel safe, including a place where we had previously resided. While speaking with the management team, we learned that one week earlier they had called the police on behalf of a resident who couldn't enter her home because a man against whom she had a restraining order was parked outside the building to intercept her. The Portland police told management they would not even send an officer to drive by, because they didn't want to intimidate the man.

During our search my wife was visiting a friend who lives in the Pearl district. While she was there our friend received a text message from a neighbor informing her that the police had been called because of a homeless person of color who had stowed his belongings on a neighbor's porch. Within the hour, police had arrived to intimidate the man off of the property.

Our friend was located by the *Tigard* Police; they gave him shoes, a tent, and a ride to the Bybee Lake hope center. Since they were not in communication with Portland police, they were unaware that he was considered a missing person, yet they helped him anyway. A stranger who had seen the fliers my wife and I had been posting called and we were reunited with our friend.

While we were bringing him to live with us, he and his mother were called and scolded for not reporting him found. Our friend didn't even know he was missing, and it boggles my mind that anyone would think his mother would call to update the report after how thoroughly it was communicated to her that the report's existence served no purpose. And thus the report was closed as if a job had been well done, when in fact nothing had been done at all

While I was still recovering from an invasive surgery the previous month, my husband and I drove four days across the country to Portland Oregon to look for a friend who had gone missing. He had last been seen on January 27th, and an official missing person report was filed on 2/6/22; case number 22-901. His mother was unable to get assistance from law enforcement—even for determining whether her son was still alive—and reached out to us for help.

We contacted his phone company to see if they could possibly give us or someone else on his account any information as to whether his phone was active—just trying to find evidence that he might be alive. The representative at Verizon (Deborah) was very understanding of our plight. She commiserated with us and informed us that they have a team for this purpose; the only hang-up is that they can only work with law enforcement—which told his mother they wouldn't confirm whether her son was alive even if they learned that he was.

Another friend who was spearheading the search reached out to Trimet to see if they could search security footage to see whether he was alive; a Trimet officer was willing to post a missing person flier, but could only assist further with the intervention of law enforcement.

We didn't know our friend's state of mind at the time, so during our search we visited locations where we thought he might go in pursuit of safety. When we stopped by a place that we had previously lived, we learned that only a week earlier one of the current residents was prevented from entering her own home because a man against whom she had a restraining order was parked outside the building to intercept her. Management had called the police to inform them of the situation. They were told that no officers would even drive by because they didn't want to intimidate the man–against whom an Oregon State judge, in a court of law, had signed the restraining order.

This reopened a personal wound. In November 2018, I attended Portland Fashion Style Awards while in possession of a restraining order against a man (Tony Iyke) who raped me while were on a networking trip in Vancouver Canada. The coordinator of the event told me I had to leave because I was making that man uncomfortable. I showed her my protective order, which she took to the directors of the event. When she returned she said that the police had been called and had said that under the circumstances I would be the one who needed to leave or I would be escorted from the property by law enforcement. I filed a report, and the officer who came to our home to take our statement said that law enforcement would never under any circumstances advise what the coordinator had told me.

Three and a half years later, the experience of a resident, who in court had appealed for and been granted protection, suggests that this is no longer the case.

While we were staying in town to look for our friend, I was visiting another friend who lives in the Pearl district. While I was there, my host received a text message from a neighbor informing my host that a homeless black man had been seen stowing his possessions on the porch of a different neighbor. The text message said that law enforcement had already been notified, and was on their way. Within the hour, the police had arrived to chase him from the property with no regard to his personal belongings.

These two contrasting situations reflect an egregious selectivity in the upholding of law. As a veteran, I am in full support of people (constituents) who choose to serve their communities, states, and country by swearing to uphold the law for justice and equality. But I'm left wondering: how is it equitable for the city of Portland to ignore the cries of the vulnerable (resident with a protective order who couldn't go home unless it were enforced) constituents whose taxes contribute to the financial stability of the police department.

While the Portland police bureau was refusing to help locate a mother's lost son, our friend was found by the Tigard police. The Tigard police provided him with sweatpants, shoes, a tent, and transportation to the Bybee Lakes Hope Center. A helpful stranger who had seen one of the many fliers we had posted over the course of several days contacted us to notify us of his location. We rushed over there immediately and were reunited with our missing brother. Our story had a happy ending, but what of those who don't have friends who can afford the days required to hang enough fliers.

After locating our friend we set about putting his affairs in order so he could come live with us. We rented a uhaul to empty his storage unit. While my husband (driving the U-haul) was waiting in line at a gas station, another vehicle backed into him. When my husband called me to let me know that the accident was putting our plan on hold, I told him to call the police; U-haul's customer service line told him the same thing. They also told him to get a police report number to give to them. My husband contacted 911 (the non-emergency line didn't answer) and despite the involvement of a commercial vehicle (the U-haul), the operator told him to exchange insurance information and abruptly ended the call. No law enforcement was dispatched to the scene of an accident with a commercial vehicle, and no case number was given to my husband to provide to uhaul and their insurance company (Repwest).

While we were returning home with our recovered friend, his mother reached out to us in distress because she had been contacted by law enforcement following up a month after she had filed a missing persons report. The officer had scolded her for not following up to report that he had been found, as if the idea would have occurred to her after it had been so clearly communicated that they were not going to look for him.

At the same instance, law enforcement called our recovered friend to ask him why he hadn't reported himself found. I was disgusted and appalled at the conversation taking place, let alone that my dear friend who had been on the streets, alone, cold and hungry was pressured to apologize to the police for not calling them to say that he had been found.

We're not asking for the corrected flow of apologies for their response and lack of assistance to a distressed mother;. We're not asking that they relinquish the "pat on the back for a job well done" when that job was done by someone else entirely. We're not asking that they apologize for not enforcing a protective order. We're not even asking for a pay reduction. We are only asking that they fulfill their function, and that the city of Portland does a thorough investigation on open cases at the Portland police bureau, and monitor the work and effort and the selectivity of cases that are addressed.

Public safety is a community effort, and the people of Portland deserve better!

ORS 146.181

Missing persons

When a person is reported as missing to any city, county or state police agency, the agency, within 12 hours thereafter, shall enter into state and federal records maintained for that purpose, a report of the missing person in a format and according to procedures established by the authorities responsible respectively for the state and federal records.

- (2) The law enforcement agency to which the report is made:
  - (a) May request from the person making the report information or material likely to be useful in identifying the missing person or the human remains of the missing person, including, but not limited to:
    - (B) The date of birth of the missing person;
    - (C) A physical description of the missing person, including the height, weight, gender, race, eye color, current hair color and natural hair color of the missing person, any identifying marks on the missing person, any prosthetics used by, or surgical implants in, the missing person and any physical anomalies of the missing person;
- (3) The law enforcement agency, upon obtaining information pursuant to subsection (2) of this section, shall make a supplementary entry of that information into the state and federal records described in subsection (1) of this section. The supplementary report shall be in a format and according to procedures established by the authorities responsible respectively for the state and federal records.
