COLLECTION AGREEMENT Between The PORTLAND, CITY OF And The UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, U.S. FOREST SERVICE MOUNT HOOD NATIONAL FOREST

This COLLECTION AGREEMENT is hereby entered into by and between the Portland, City of, hereinafter referred to as "the Portland Water Bureau", and the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), Forest Service, Mount Hood National Forest, hereinafter referred to as the "U.S. Forest Service," under the provisions of the Cooperative Funds Act of June 30, 1914 (16 U.S.C. 498 as amended by Pub. L. 104-127).

<u>Background</u>: The U.S. Forest Service and the Portland Water Bureau have a longstanding relationship in the Bull Run Watershed. The Bull Run Watershed is the City of Portland's source for drinking water and is located on the NW edge of the Mt. Hood National Forest. Hickman Butte Lookout is located in the Bull Run Watershed and the Portland Water Bureau desires that the lookout be fully staffed so as to provide protection services to the watershed. Since 2007, the Portland Water Bureau and the U.S. Forest Service have jointly contributed and cooperated in the staffing of the lookout. By staffing the Hickman Butte Lookout, both parties mutually benefit in that fire surveillance is occurring both within the watershed and in lands which surround the watershed. Early fire detection helps protect natural resources and the water supply for the City of Portland.

Title: Hickman Butte Lookout Services

I. PURPOSE: The purpose of this agreement, and incorporated Financial Plan, is to document the voluntary contribution of funds from the Portland Water Bureau to the U.S. Forest Service to provide lookout services at Hickman Butte Lookout tower. The fire lookout services include the detection and reporting of smokes or fires, monitoring of radio traffic and acting as a relay, performing weather data collection and observation for the Bull Run Management Unit and adjacent lands, and performing minor facility maintenance at the Lookout. Services shall be accomplished through a contract by the U.S. Forest Service or by U.S. Forest Service staffing.

II. THE PORTLAND WATER BUREAU SHALL:

A. <u>LEGAL AUTHORITY</u>. The Portland Water Bureau shall have the legal authority to enter into this agreement, and the institutional, managerial, and financial capability to

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ensure proper planning, management, and completion of the project, which includes funds sufficient to pay the nonfederal share of project costs, when applicable.

- B. Perform in accordance with the Financial Plan.
- C. Upon presentation of a Bill for Collection, deposit with the U.S. Forest Service the amount agreed to in the Financial Plan.
- D. Annually provide \$14,500.00 for costs associated with Lookout staffing.
- E. Nothing in the agreement precludes the Portland Water Bureau from contributing additional funds for staffing based on awarded contract cost, additional maintenance and repair costs, above what is identified in the agreement, when requested by the U.S. Forest Service and in the interest of both parties. The Portland Water Bureau shall coordinate with the Portland Water Bureau's Chief Engineer and the U.S. Forest Service prior to any maintenance activities. See Provision *O. Modifications*.

III. THE U.S. FOREST SERVICE SHALL:

A. <u>ADVANCE BILLING</u>. The cost liability to the The Portland Water Bureau for this agreement is \$14,500.00 per City Fiscal Year for a period of five (5) years for a total of amount of \$72,500.00. The U.S. Forest Service shall bill the Portland Water Bureau prior to commencement of work for deposits sufficient to cover the estimated costs (including overhead) for the specific payment period. **Overhead shall not be assessed due to mutual benefit.**

Billing Method: Scheduled Billing:

- 1) First billing of \$14,500.00 for fiscal year 2022 will be on final signature of this document.
- 2) Second billing of \$14,500.00 for fiscal year 2023 will be on February 1,2023
- 3) Third billing of \$14,500.00 for fiscal year 2024 will be on February 1,2024
- 4) Fourth billing of \$14,500.00 for fiscal year 2025 will be on February 1,2025
- 5) Fifth billing of \$14,500.00 for fiscal year 2026 will be on February 1,2026

- B. Perform in accordance with the attached Financial Plan.
- C. Provide funds to cover the balance of Lookout staffing up to \$4,000.00 annually and contribute \$1,500.00 annually to maintenance costs. Any additional staffing cost beyond those identified under this agreement shall be borne by the U.S. Forest Service.

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- D. Provide a financial report to the Portland Water Bureau at the end of each fire season. The report will document the total amount paid to staff the Lookout, the Portland Water Bureau's share of the costs and the U.S. Forest Service's share of the costs. The report will also document the costs for equipment and materials associated with minor maintenance work. The annual financial report will be provided within three weeks of the date that the Contractor's final invoice is paid or by November 15 if the U.S. Forest Service is staffing the Lookout.
- E. Provide on an annual basis, lookout services at Hickman Butte for fire surveillance in the Bull Run Watershed and surrounding lands. Either contract or U.S. Forest Service personnel may provide lookout services. The U.S. Forest Service will be responsible for awarding and overseeing the contract if contract services are needed.
- F. Nothing in this agreement precludes the U.S. Forest Service from requesting additional funds from the Portland Water Bureau to pay for staffing based on awarded contract cost or additional maintenance costs, above what is identified in the agreement when in the interest of both parties. See Provision *O. Modifications*.

IV. IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED AND UNDERSTOOD BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES THAT:

- B. <u>REFUNDS</u>. Funds collected in advance by the U.S. Forest Service, which are not spent or obligated for the project(s) approved under this agreement, may be refunded to the Portland Water Bureau, authorized for use for a new agreement by the Portland Water Bureau, or waived by the Portland Water Bureau. A Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS) number and registration in the System for Award Management (SAM) by the Portland Water Bureau may be necessary to process a refund. Due to processing costs, any balance less than \$25 shall not be refunded to the Portland Water Bureau.
- C. <u>MEMBERS OF CONGRESS</u>. Pursuant to 41 U.S.C. 22, no member of, or delegate to, Congress shall be admitted to any share or part of this agreement, or benefits that may arise therefrom, either directly or indirectly.
- D. <u>FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT (FOIA)</u>. Public access to agreement records must not be limited, except when such records must be kept confidential and would have been exempted from disclosure pursuant to Freedom of Information regulations (5 U.S.C. 552). Requests for research data are subject to 2 CFR 215.36.

Public access to culturally sensitive data and information of Federally-recognized Tribes may also be explicitly limited by P.L. 110-234, Title VIII Subtitle B §8106 (2009 Farm Bill).

- E. <u>PARTICIPATION IN SIMILAR ACTIVITIES</u>. This agreement in no way restricts the U.S. Forest Service or the Portland Water Bureau from participating in similar activities with other public or private agencies, organizations, and individuals.
- F. <u>ENDORSEMENT</u>. Any of the Portland Water Bureau's contributions made under this agreement do not by direct reference or implication convey U.S. Forest Service endorsement of the Portland Water Bureau's products or activities.
- G. <u>NOTICES</u>. Any communication affecting the operations covered by this agreement by the U.S. Forest Service or the Portland Water Bureau will be sufficient only if in writing and delivered in person, mailed, or transmitted electronically by e-mail or fax, as follows:

To the U.S. Forest Service Program Manager, at the address specified in the agreement.

To the Portland Water Bureau, at the Portland Water Bureau's address shown in the agreement or such other address designated within the agreement. UAS

Notices are effective when delivered in accordance with this provision, or on the effective date of the notice, whichever is later.

- H. <u>USE OF U.S. FOREST SERVICE INSIGNIA</u>. In order for the Portland Water Bureau to use the U.S. Forest Service insignia on any published media, such as a Web page, printed publication, or audiovisual production, permission must be granted from the U.S. Forest Service's Office of Communications (Washington Office). A written request will be submitted by Forest Service **MOUNT HOOD NATIONAL FOREST** to the Office of Communications Assistant Director, Visual Information and Publishing Services prior to use of the insignia. The U.S. Forest Service **MOUNT HOOD NATIONAL FOREST** will notify the Portland Water Bureau when permission is granted.
- I. <u>U.S. FOREST SERVICE ACKNOWLEDGED IN PUBLICATIONS, AUDIOVISUALS,</u> <u>AND ELECTRONIC MEDIA</u>. The Portland Water Bureau shall acknowledge U.S. Forest Service support in any publications, audiovisuals, and electronic media developed as a result of this agreement.
- J. <u>PROPERTY IMPROVEMENTS</u>. Improvements placed by The Portland Water Bureau on National Forest System land at the direction or with the approval of the U.S. Forest Service become property of the United States. These improvements are subject to the same regulations and administration of the U.S. Forest Service as would other national forest improvements of a similar nature. No part of this agreement entitles the Portland Water Bureau to any interest in the improvements, other than the right to use them under applicable U.S. Forest Service regulations.
- K. <u>PURCHASE OF ASSETS</u>. Any assets (such as equipment, property, or improvements) purchased by the U.S. Forest Service with the Portland Water Bureau's contributions shall become the property of the U.S. Forest Service.
- L. <u>NONDISCRIMINATION STATEMENT PRINTED, ELECTRONIC, OR</u> <u>AUDIOVISUAL MATERIAL.</u> The Portland Water Bureau shall include the following statement, in full, in any printed, audiovisual material, or electronic media for public distribution developed or printed with any Federal funding.

In accordance with Federal law and U.S. Department of Agriculture policy, this institution is prohibited from discriminating on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability. (Not all prohibited bases apply to all programs.)

- M. <u>TERMINATION FOR COLLECTION AGREEMENTS</u>. Either party, in writing, may terminate this agreement in whole, or in part, at any time before the date of expiration. The U.S. Forest Service shall not incur any new obligations for the terminated portion of this agreement after the effective date of termination and shall cancel as many obligations as possible. Full credit must be allowed for U.S. Forest Service expenses and all noncancelable obligations properly incurred up to the effective date of termination.
- N. <u>DEBARMENT AND SUSPENSION</u>. The Portland Water Bureau shall immediately inform the U.S. Forest Service if they or any of their principals are presently excluded, debarred, or suspended from entering into covered transactions with the Federal Government according to the terms of 2 CFR Part 180. Additionally, should the Portland Water Bureau or any of their principals receive a transmittal letter or other official Federal notice of debarment or suspension, then they shall notify the U.S. Forest Service without undue delay. This applies whether the exclusion, debarment, or suspension is voluntary or involuntary.
- O. <u>MODIFICATIONS</u>. Modifications within the scope of this agreement must be made by mutual consent of the parties, by the issuance of a written modification signed and dated by all properly authorized, signatory officials, prior to any changes being performed. Requests for modification should be made, in writing, at least 60 days prior to implementation of the requested change. The U.S. Forest Service is not obligated to fund any changes not properly approved in advance.
- P. <u>COMMENCEMENT/EXPIRATION DATE</u>. This agreement is executed as of the date of the last signature, and is effective through five years from the last signature at which time it will expire. The expiration date is the final date for completion of all work activities under this agreement.
- Q. <u>AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVES</u>. By signature below, each party certifies that the individuals listed in this document as representatives of the individual parties are authorized to act in their respective areas for matters related to this agreement.
