Today's Requested Council Action: Approve the 82nd Avenue Jurisdictional Transfer

Direct the Transportation Commissioner to sign the jurisdictional transfer agreement (effective June 1, 2022)

Accept \$80 million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding from the State













Transfer Agreement















What is transferring?

- 82nd Avenue from NE Killingsworth to SE Clatsop
 - Some sidewalks will transfer, others are already owned by the City
 - Stormwater assets
- ODOT retains ownership of:
 - 82nd Avenue bridge over I-84 and railroad
 - Intersection and signals at NE Killingsworth, NE Webster & SE Powell
- Transfer date: June 1, 2022
















Funding for 82nd Avenue Transportation Improvements

Near-term Critical Fixes
















Improvements already funded (2022-2024)

- New pedestrian crossings along the corridor, enhanced with flashing beacons or signals
- Traffic signal rebuilds at NE Davis St and NE Glisan St
- Repaving south of SE Foster Rd to city limits







Near Term Critical Fixes (2023-2026)

Category	Budget
Lighting	\$2 - 5 million
Crossings	\$12 – 15 million
Corridor Safety	\$12 – 15 million
Major Maintenance	
Paving, Curb Ramps	\$50+ million
Traffic Signals	730+ HIIIIIOH
TOTAL Funding	\$80 million
















Lighting

- Construction in 2022-2023








Crossings




18 new crossings

Corridor Safety Improvements



- Signal timing to reduce speeding
- **Improve visibility** by updating signs, roadway striping, and signal heads
- Implementation in 2022-2023





















Major Maintenance



- 1.5 miles of repaving is already funded by ODOT (south of Foster)
- 2 more miles of repaving funded by ARPA
 - NE Siskiyou to NE Schuyler
 - SE Division to SE Foster
- Curb ramps will be upgraded along with repaving projects


















Major Maintenance



- 9 signal rebuilds
- Projects will include accessibility upgrades and safety enhancements



- Small business technical support
















Community Engagement

- Coordination with Oregon Walks, APANO, OPAL, Verde, Unite Oregon and other partners












