




### Renter Households in the City of Portland




Rentership in the City of Portland by Race & Ethnicity








#### Affordability Gap






## Rental Market (Asking Rent)



# Rental Market (Asking Rent by Bedroom Type)




Rental Market (Vacancy Rate)



#### Summary

In Portland, Renter households increased by 5.2 percent from 2014 to 2019

Renter households on average have half the income of owneroccupied households

Low-income households tend to be people of color, who were most likely to be affected by the aftermath of COVID-19

There is a considerable deficit of affordable units for 0-30% and 31-50% AMI households

Rent arrears have been consistently high over the last two years

Despite emergency rental assistance, eviction challenges loom ahead

City and PHB have been able to expand the network of culturally specific service providers to reach out to the affected communities.
