- 1. That the placement of Neighborhood Watch signs will conform to the requirements of ordinance # 360
- 2. That the Crime Prevention Detail of PPB will be informed of the exact location of all signs placed within 30 days of placement.
- 3. That signs will only be placed in neighborhoods which:
 - a. have held a documented Neighborhood Watch meeting
 - b. have completed a block map
 - c. have been recommended by a NAC Crime Prevention Specialist
- 4. That signs will be engraved with the nearest street address prior to placement.

An Ordinance granting a revocable permit to the Bureau of Police to authorize the placement of "Neighborhood Watch Signs" within public right-of-ways under certain conditions, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Neighborhoods Against Crime with the aid of the Crime Prevention Division of the Bureau of Police has instituted an observation and reporting program by which the residents of blocks can organize to better protect themselves against neighborhood intruders who are there for unlawful purposes.
- 2. It has been proposed that when residents of a block have met certain requirements that they be allowed to place signs within the right-of-way which read "THIS BLOCK PROTECTED BY NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH".
- 3. The granting of this request will not be detrimental to the public interest under certain conditions.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. A revocable permit is hereby granted the Bureau of Police to have the signs referred to in Section 1,2 placed in the public rights-of-way subject to the following conditions:
 - (1) Signs and signposts shall be furnished and installed by the requesting neighborhood.
 - (2) All sign locations shall be approved by the Traffic Engineer.
 - (3) The signs when installed shall conform to the City Engineer's Standard Plan No. 3-49.
 - (4) The Bureau of Police shall maintain a record of installed sign locations.
 - (5) The Bureau of Maintenance shall remove signs not in conformance with the City Engineer's Standard Plan No. 3-49 and the Traffic Engineer's approved location.
 - (6) The Bureau of Police is responsible for costs of any liability incurred by the City resulting from this program.

ORDINANCE No.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because delay in the enactment of this Ordinance will result in an unnecessary hardship of uncertainty on the part of the applicant as to the status of the requested permit; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
