

ORDINANCE NO. 152866

An Ordinance authorizing the Purchasing Agent to sign a Purchase Order as a contract with American Business Communications, Inc., for a ringback feature on the 911 telephone system, transferring \$14,664 from the General Fund to the Electronic Services Operating Fund authorizing the drawing and delivery of warrants, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The Bureau of Electronic Services requires a ringback feature on the 911 telephone system currently in service at the Bureau of Emergency Communications;
2. The Director of the Bureau of Emergency Communications recommends addition of this feature to the system;
3. Engineering information required to implement this feature is now available;
4. The system was installed by American Business Communications, Inc., and they have the experience, expertise, and equipment to provide the necessary ringback addition;
5. The cost of this feature is fully reimbursable from the 911 tax collected by Multnomah County.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Purchasing Agent shall sign a Purchase Order to serve as a contract with American Business Communications, Inc., 8233 S.W. Cirrus, Beaverton, Oregon 97005, for the ringback feature on the 911 telephone system, at the estimated cost of \$14,664, without advertising for bids. The P.O. shall be approved as to form by the City Attorney.
- b. The Mayor and the Auditor are authorized to draw and deliver a warrant chargeable to the 1981-82 Electronic Services Budget (36000295.630) when demand is presented, approved by the proper authorities.
