

ORDINANCE NO. 152930

An Ordinance authorizing the Purchasing Agent to waive advertisement and to solicit bids for contract services for hauling and utilizing wastewater sludge, for the Bureau of Wastewater Treatment, authorizing negotiations for a contract or contracts with the bidder whose bid is most advantageous to the City, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. That the Purchasing Agent advertised and received proposals for hauling and utilizing wastewater sludge pursuant to specifications filed on July 8, 1981.
2. That three proposals were received and opened on August 25, 1981.
3. That the low bidder was unable to implement his proposal and the cost of the other proposals exceeded the budgeted funds available, therefore, all bids have been rejected.
4. The three original bidders have recently expressed interest in submitting new proposals based on the plans and specifications above-referenced, which will be revised for the term of the contract, and a fourth party has requested an opportunity to submit a proposal.
5. That time has now become a major factor considering the short term for which the contract is to be in effect and the time saved in waiving advertisement by not going through the formal bid procedure can be applied to the contract time rather than the formal bid process and this will reduce the amount of wastewater sludge being disposed of at the St. Johns Landfill, thereby reducing disposal costs to the City, and the waiving of advertisement will not restrict competition as all known interested parties will be requested to submit proposals.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Purchasing Agent is hereby authorized to waive advertisement and solicit bids for hauling and utilization of wastewater sludge based upon plans and specifications on file.

- b. The Purchasing Agent, the City Engineer and the City Attorney are hereby authorized to negotiate for a contract or contracts with the bidder or bidders whose bid is most advantageous to the City for the project described in Section 1 hereof.
- c. Subsequent to negotiations for a contract, a recommendation will be made to Council for Council approval and award of a contract or contracts.

Section 2. In order not to delay receipt of proposals to accomplish the project set forth in Section 1, and to evaluate and negotiate for a contract, an emergency exists, and therefore, this ordinance shall be in effect from and after its passage by the Council.
