ORDINANCE NO. 152936

An Ordinance granting a revocable permit to the Portland Council of Camp Fire Girls to hold a Camp Fire Celebration and release helium balloons on the St. John's Pedestrian Mall on March 20, 1982 between the hours of 1:00 p.m. and 3:00 p.m., and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The Portland Council of Camp Fire Girls has applied through Billie Rosenblum, 718 W. Burnside Street #410, Portland, OR 97209, to release helium balloons from the St. John's Pedestrian Mall located on the north side of N. Philadelphia Avenue, between N. Lombard Street and N. Ivanhoe Street.
2. The event will take place on March 20, 1982 between the hours of 1:00 p.m. and 3:00 p.m.
3. The event is a "Birthday Celebration" to be held in association with Camp Fire Week.
4. The Federal Aviation Administration has no regulations restricting balloon releases of this nature.
5. Approximately 150 girls will participate in this event.
6. The event, under certain conditions, will not be detrimental to the public interest.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. A revocable permit is hereby granted to the Portland Council of Camp Fire Girls to hold a Camp Fire Celebration and release helium balloons on the St. John's Transit Mall located on N. Philadelphia Avenue between N. Lombard Street and N. Ivanhoe Street on March 20, 1982 from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m., subject to the following conditions:
 - (1) Nothing contained herein shall limit the authority of the Bureau of Police in maintaining the public peace and safety, and upon request the permittee shall immediately restore the sidewalk to its normal public use.
 - (2) This permit shall not exempt the permittee from obtaining any license or permit required by the City Code or Ordinances for any act to be performed under this permit, nor shall this permit waive the provisions of any City Code, Ordinance, or the City Charter, except as herein stated.

- (3) This permit is revocable at any time and no expenditure of money or lapse of time, or other act or thing, shall operate as an estoppel against the City of Portland or be held to give the permittee any vested or other right. Upon revocation of this permit by the Council, the permittee shall remove the barricades immediately and restore the street area as required by and to the satisfaction of the City Engineer.
- (4) The permittee shall hold the City of Portland, its officers, agents, and employees free and harmless from any claims for damages to persons or property, including legal fees and costs of defending any actions or suits, including any appeals which may result from use of the street area under this permit by providing evidence of insurance protecting the City of Portland, its officers, agents and employees as follows:
 Bodily injury \$100,000 for one claimant and \$300,000 for one occurrence, property damage \$50,000 for one claimant and \$300,000 for one occurrence, said insurance to be kept in full force and effect at all times. This permit is revoked without further action of the Council if this insurance is permitted to lapse, is cancelled or, for any other reason, becomes inoperative.


Section 2. This Ordinance will not become effective until the permittee has filed with the City Auditor a document, which has been approved by the City Attorney, accepting the terms and conditions hereof. This Ordinance shall be automatically revoked without further consideration by the Council if the acceptance together with documents and fees required are not on file with the City Auditor by 5:00 p.m. Friday, March 19, 1982.

Section 3. The Council declares that an emergency exists because delay in the enactment of this Ordinance will result in an unnecessary hardship of uncertainty on the part of the applicant as to the status of the requested permit; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
