AMENDMENT No. 1
TO
AGREEMENT TO FURNISH MATERIAL AND SERVICE
TO THE
METROPOLITAN SERVICE DISTRICT
FOR ASSISTANCE IN METRO'S
YARD DEBRIS COLLECTION ALTERNATIVES PROGRAM

This Agreement amends the Material and Service Agreement between the METROPOLITAN SERVICE DISTRICT (METRO) and the CITY OF PORTLAND (CONTRACTOR); Contract No. 81-9-857 SW, dated August, 1981.

The parties agree as follows:

1. The CONTRACTOR agrees to perform the revised Scope of Work as described and attached hereto as Attachment A.
2. CONTRACTOR shall complete all services that are specifically to be furnished under the original agreement and this Amendment no later than June 30, 1982.
3. CONTRACTOR shall prepare billings which relate directly to major tasks as described in the original Scope of Work and Attachment B.
4. This Amendment extends the August 28, 1981 Agreement between METRO and the CONTRACTOR to cover work described in Attachment A.

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5. METRO shall compensate the CONTRACTOR for services performed and materials delivered as amended in paragraph 1 of this Amendment; however, the maximum amount for work completed in accordance with the original Agreement and paragraph 1 will not be exceeded unless specifically authorized in writing by METRO. The maximum sum for work completed in accordance with the original Agreement and paragraph 1 shall not exceed SIX THOUSAND AND NO/100THS (\$6,000) DOLLARS which sum includes all reimbursable expenses.

Attachment "A"

SCOPE OF WORK

The City proposes to assist neighborhoods in organizing and conducting 12 cleanups in the Spring of 1982. Cleanups may be set up as either general cleanups or as vegetative yard debris-only cleanups. The type of cleanup will be chosen by the sponsoring neighborhoods. General cleanups will be set up to separate vegetative yard debris from other collected material.

Drop boxes will be used to collect material at one central site within a neighborhood. Promotion of cleanups will be through door-to-door delivery of flyers by neighborhood volunteers. Curbside collection may be made available through neighborhood volunteers for senior and handicapped residents unable to bring their material to the central site.

Collection sites will be staffed so that vegetative yard debris is not contaminated by other waste. All collected vegetative yard debris will be disposed of at a METRO-sponsored processing site.

Cleanups will be conducted on Saturdays only. Selection of cleanup dates will be by participating neighborhoods. Two cleanups may occur on the same date only if one occurs in a neighborhood which has successfully conducted a cleanup in the previous year.

Ten general cleanups will be conducted as provided by the City's ongoing cleanup program. METRO's assistance for these cleanups will be to offset the additional costs of separating vegetative yard debris from other collected material. Costs of two additional cleanups will be paid by METRO. These two may be either general or yard debris-only cleanups; preference will be given to neighborhoods requesting yard debris-only cleanups.

The Bureau of Buildings will send a letter to the Chairperson of each neighborhood association outlining the organization and requirements of cleanups and inviting them to request assistance in sponsoring a Spring cleanup. The letter will explain that a neighborhood may choose to do either a vegetative yard debris-only cleanup or a general cleanup.

Neighborhoods will be asked to submit requests no later than February 12, 1982, so that selection of participants and cleanup dates may begin. The Bureau of Buildings will notify METRO by March 1, 1982, as to which neighborhoods will sponsor cleanups, probable dates cleanups will be held, and what type of cleanups have been requested.

METHOD OF PAYMENT

Based on costs resulting from work performed by the City of Portland in accordance with Attachment "A", SCOPE OF WORK, METRO will reimburse the City of Portland an amount not to exceed six thousand (6,000) dollars.

An Ordinance authorizing an amendment of contract 19709 between the City and METRO for yard trimming collection program, decreasing appropriations in the Federal Grants and General Funds from \$18,830 to \$6,000; and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. Ordinance 151974 passed by the Council July 15, 1981 authorized a contract, Number 19709 between the City of Portland and the Metropolitan Service District (METRO) to collect separated yard trimmings as a part of a grant study received by METRO.
2. The Neighborhood Division of the Bureau of Buildings and METRO have agreed on a revised scope of work as set out in Attachment A.
3. The cleanups will begin in the Spring of 1982 rather than the Fall of 1981 which is the reason for the reduction in the contract amount.
4. No local match is required. Indirect project cost is reduced from \$730 to \$240 and has already been charged to the project.
5. It is important that this Ordinance be passed immediately so the revised scope of work (Attachment A) may be implemented for Spring yard cleanups.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. That the Commissioner of Public Utilities and the Auditor are authorized to execute this amendment to Contract #19709 between the City and METRO which changes the scope of work per Attachment A as attached to Amendment I and decreasing the contract amount from \$18,830 to \$6,000.
- b. All the provisions of Contract number 19709 shall remain in force and effect.
