ORDINANCE No. 153015

An Ordinance extending the temporary prohibition of the establishment of any new commercial amusement businesses in the City for an additional thirty (30) day period; and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. That on January 28, 1982, in enacting Ordinance No. 152788, effective on that date, which established a sixty (60) day moratorium, the Council made the following findings:
 - a. That Sections 14.68.270, 14.68.280 and 14.68.285, relating to the permit process for certain commercial amusement devices, games and machines, are in need of revision to reflect current community standards, device technology and law enforcement problems.
 - b. That Chapter 14.50, relating to the regulation of commercial amusement businesses is in need of revision to reflect current community standards, device technology and law enforcement problems.
 - c. That a temporary moratorium of sixty (60) days on the establishment of any new commercial amusement businesses should be imposed until the respective code provisions can be reviewed by law enforcement and licensing personnel, gaming industry representatives, neighborhood associations and other interested persons, and such code provisions can be appropriately revised.
2. That several meetings have been conducted with affected industry persons and concerned citizens, and substantial progress has been made on completing the revision of such Code provisions, but that approximately thirty (30) additional days are needed to complete this process.
3. That the temporary moratorium on the establishment of any new commercial amusement businesses should be extended for thirty (30) days so that the revision of applicable Code provisions can be completed.

ORDINANCE No.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. For an additional period of thirty (30) days from the effective date of this ordinance, no person nor any business entity shall cause or permit the establishment of any commercial amusement business at any place within the limits of the City. The term "establishment" of such business shall include the opening of such business as a new business, the relocation of such business, or the conversion of any existing business, or part thereof, to such commercial amusement business. The term "commercial amusement business" shall be defined as in Section 14.50.020(1) of the Code.

Section 2. The Council declares that, in order to ensure that no further commercial amusement businesses are established until the current regulatory code provisions can be updated, an emergency exists, and this Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
