

Captain Moore.

Dear Sir: -

In reply to a general request by the License Committee in regard to places where we have had complaints as to liquor selling, will report that the Rainbow Grill has been a constant offender in selling liquor to persons under 21 years of age.

On November 26th, 1914, they sold without question to four persons, two young men and two young women, all under the age of 21.

In September, 1914, we had a girl of 18 to whom absinthe had been sold without question.

I am also informed that they sold liquor to a party the other evening, among whom was a 16 year old girl, and no questions were asked as to her age.

Names of these persons will be given on request, but we have not had sufficient evidence to take the cases into court, but there is no doubt as to the violation of the law.
