Plumbing fixtures shall be constructed of dense, durable, non-absorbent materials and shall have smooth, impervious surfaces, free from unnecessary concealed fouling surfaces. Except as permitted elsewhere in this code, fixtures shall comply with the quality and design of nationally recognized applicable standards reference din Table 1701.1.

Proposed Design

The sink in question is a trough style dense limestone and is installed in a bathroom. It was professionally made by the Stonecenter Inc. at 1504 SE Woodward St., Portland. The joints are tightly fitted and epoxy sealed. The surface was then polished smooth after all surface voids were filled with epoxy leaving a perfectly smooth and dense surface. 3 coats of "Professional Sealer's Choice Gold" sealer by Aquar Mix was then applied.

Reason for alternative Equivalent health: Aqua mix sealer contains an anti-microbial protection for mold and mildew. That, combined with the smooth epoxy filled surface, will perform as well as any other approved sink.

Accessibility: N/A

Strucural capacity: The sink is fiberglass reinforced and fully sported beneath by a plywood cabinet.

APPEAL DECISION

Use of non-listed limestone sink: Granted as proposed.

The Administrative Appeal Board finds that the information submitted by the appellant demonstrates that the approved modifications or alternate methods are consistent with the intent of the code; do not lessen health, safety, accessibility, life, fire safety or structural requirements; and that special conditions unique to this project make strict application of those code sections impractical.
