The friends were Mrs. Canaday and Mrs. Olive Galloway, 496 Tenino av. Brandishing a pistol and muttering incoherent words, Sapp advanced upon the women.

Mrs. Canaday walked up to Sapp, took the pistol and forced him to flee from the house at the point of the weapon.
