Code Section	OAR 918-650-0055
	Grey Water (918-650-0055) - Gray Water Waste Disposal System. Recreation parks which supply
	water must provide a sewage disposal system or a gray water waste disposal sump for each six
	spaces that meets the requirements of the Department of Environmental Quality.
	Grey Water - A sink that drains into a 1500 gallon grey water tank that will be pumped as needed.





**Reason for alternative** Code 918-650-0065 says, "The building official may exempt any requirement of these rules regarding toilets, waste water disposal, spacing or plan review and plan review fees, to meet special short-term campground needs if public health will not be endangered."

We are asking for these alternates as a temporary (6 months) solution to the toilet and grey water needs of the village until we are able to develop more permanent solutions (connect to a sewer line). This alternate method will meet the needs of the village while not endangering public health.

#### APPEAL DECISION

1. Temporary use of portable toilet facility in lieu of permanent structure with permanent connection to sewer: Granted as proposed for 6 months from the date of the building permit issuance.

2. Temporary use of grey water tank in lieu of permanent connection to sewer: Granted as proposed for 6 months from the date of the building permit issuance.

The Administrative Appeal Board finds that the information submitted by the appellant demonstrates that the approved modifications or alternate methods are consistent with the intent of the code; do not lessen health, safety, accessibility, life, fire safety or structural requirements; and that special conditions unique to this project make strict application of those code sections impractical.

Pursuant to City Code Chapter 24.10, you may appeal this decision to the Building Code Board of Appeal within 90 calendar days of the date this decision is published.
