

Bull Run TREATMENT PROJECTS Improved Corrosion Control Treatment


- Construct facilities with improved treatment tools to help reduce risk of lead exposure at customers' taps
- Completed on schedule
- Completed on budget (\$20.2M)



ICCT construction equity results


Contracting:

Workforce:


 26,500 hours from minority and female tradespeople






Filtration Facility

- 135 mgd conventional filtration
- On schedule
 - 90% design to Oregon
 Health Authority October
 2022
- Within program budget
 - Continued costmanagement
 - \$40M in value engineering

- Holistic approach
- LEED certification and **net-zero** energy use for Admin Building
- Envision Certification for the site
- **Low-carbon** concrete for process basins and structures
- Integrating swales and other stormwater management


Bull Run TREATMENT PROJECTS

Filtration Pipelines

- 35,000 l.f. of seismically reinforced pipelines and one new intertie
- On schedule
 - 90% design complete in December this year
- Within program budget
 - Continued cost-management
 - **\$70M** in value engineering



Reduced planned pipe routes and number of new intertie facilities




Filtration Projects equity contracting

PTE

- Approximately \$35M contracted with COBID-certified firms
- 26 participating in Capacity Building Support program
- On track to exceed City goal of 20%

Workforce

- Actively engaged with the community
- First large project in region to implement new Regional Workforce Equity Agreement

- Sharing regular updates through project e-news, online events, social media, and more...
- Using community values to inform project decisions
 - Focus Groups
 - Water Stewards Pilot
 - Outreach to Indigenous community










Looking forward
